Washington and Nelson County residents who are enrolled or planning to enroll in the UofL School of Medicine

(Washington County residents will receive initial preference)



What Does it Cover?

\$10,000 awarded annually

Maximum of \$40,000 per student

Can be used for: tuition, room & board, research materials, travel, books, or supplies

Renewable for 4 years

(Nelson County Students must reapply each year)
