#### **Direct Services**

# Life Enrichment Center

CCSS offers day services at the Life Enrichment Center (LEC), structured with an educational approach with emphasis on socialization, community inclusion and exercise. The monthly calendar reflects a theme for the month that incorporates activities promoting individual goals, community activities, and volunteerism in small group or individual settings.

Over the last five years, CCSS has supplemented the program \$423,864. A program found to be essential to the Callaway community since 1990. In 2021, CCSS invested **\$108,808** in providing services for the **16** participants enrolled.

#### **Indirect Services**

The Callaway County Special Services Board and Administration invest a great deal of time and resources to provide support to those individuals and families of Callaway County. Through funded service programs and funding contracts, people are able to receive safe and affordable housing with personal care and oversight, employment training and sheltered employment, public wheelchair accessible transportation, therapy services, organized group activities, adaptive equipment, home modifications, and more.

#### 2021 IFSP Funding Highlights

7 people were able to receive OT therapy, PT evaluations and transportation services

11 people was able to get adaptive equipment totaling **\$8,136** 

215 households received CCSS Pandemic Packets that included masks and hand sanitizer

North Callaway students benefitted from \$1,528 for adaptive equipment

iCan Bike received \$1,307 for 6 camp participant registration fees and for the purchase of adaptive equipment for 4 individuals

Special Olympics received \$1,000 for bowling and other offsite events

2 individuals are able to live more independently with home modifications

## **Funded Services**

#### Partnership for Hope

Partnership for Hope provides a funding support bridge through the Department of Mental Health for services that are not covered by other means or until other sources are approved. Since 2011, Callaway County Special Services has authorized \$271,572 for services including transportation, medical equipment and supplies, personal assistance, assessments and evaluations, home and vehicle modifications, speech therapy, job preparation, respite, training, and temporary residential services. In 2021, **\$29,519** were committed for **21** waiver slots.

#### Individual & Family Support Pilot

In the last five years, \$123,730 was committed for the purchase of 162 services for care and services through the Individual and Family Pilot, which are funded 100% by Callaway County tax levy dollars. The Pilot provides a critical support bridge to individuals where funding is not available by other means. Services are approved on an individual need basis. A total of **\$36,895** was authorized for **31** services in 2021.

#### Community Connections

CCSS administrative staff reach out to community members through Community Resource Network group, social media and verbal contacts to increase volunteer opportunities and community membership. Newsletters were and continue to be published by CCSS and mailed to individuals and families throughout the year for community resources and activities, as well as activities held by Callaway County community groups iCan Bike camp and Special Olympics. In-person activities were placed on hold due to the pandemic.

## **Accessible Housing**

#### Fisher Heights Apartments

The Callaway County Special Services board of directors serves as the board for Liberty Apartments dba Fisher Heights Apartments. In 2021, CCSS invested **\$19,061** to support the property and numerous hours were devoted to offering a local community living resource that is safe, accessible and affordable to **15** individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Fisher Heights Apartments has a contracted management company to manage day-to-day operations. Other administrative duties provided by CCSS include:

- onsite routinely for quarterly health and safety inspections
- arranges external property inspections of liability insurance risk assessments, fire safety, fire alarms and emergency safety systems, backflow and sprinkler systems, and HVAC/water heater systems
- property replacement projects planning
- emergency maintenance issues
- monthly reviews of financial statements and assistance in the annual budget process

- annual financial audit
- annual review of business insurance policies
- contracts for snow removal
- arranges professional cleaning
- collaboration with onsite residential services providers and team members when needed



## **Contracted Services**

#### Remade for a Purpose

Remade for a Purpose trains and employs people with disabilities. CCSS disbursed \$220,138 in the last five years to the resale boutique. In 2021, Remade received **\$53,358**, supporting **9** individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

#### Callaway County Extended Employment

Kingdom Projects, Inc. dba Callaway County Extended Employment continues to provide sheltered employment for disabled individuals in Callaway County. In the last five years, CCSS has provided \$1,033,868 to the workshop. In 2021, CCEE received **\$217,828**, to support **14** employees with intellectual and developmental disabilities.



#### Serve, Inc.

"CCEE is very grateful for the funds provided by CCSS. Our goal is to "be here" and available to any qualified individual by offering a safe place for vocational training and always offer a variety of jobs providing various skill levels for their individual needs." -2021 CCEE Funding Application

Each year, transportation service provider Serve, Inc. applies for a matching grant for handicapped accessible transport buses. From 2017-2021, CCSS was able to authorize match funds of \$109,850 for 10 buses. Due to supply line issues, Serve, Inc. was unable to purchase two new vehicles in 2021. Serve, Inc. continues to receive funding for transportation services through waiver match funds by the Department of Mental Health. In 2021, Serve, Inc. was paid \$1,550 for transportation services through CCSS' Individual and Family Support Pilot programs for non-waivered services.
