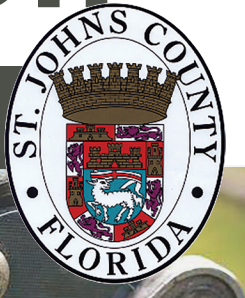


A HOW-TO GUIDE to Prepare Yard Waste for Curbside Collection

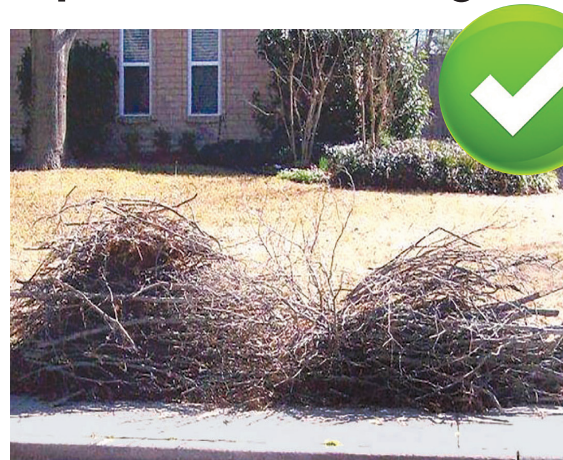
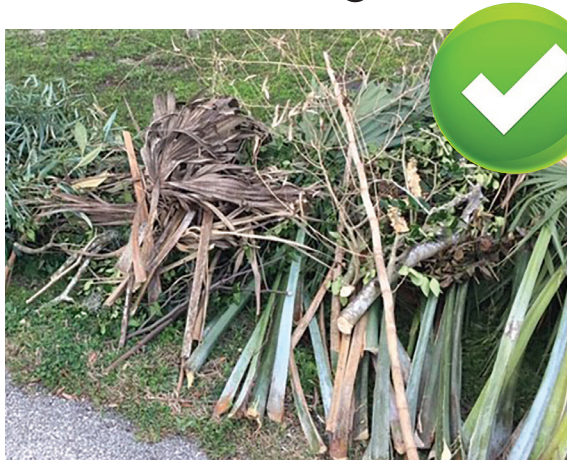


CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION IS AS EASY AS 1, 2, 3!

1. BAG, BUNDLE or CONTAINERIZE. Leaves, grass clippings, twigs and small pieces of yard waste. Containerized yard waste should **NOT** exceed 32-gallons in size and 50 pounds in weight.



2. STACK NEATLY PARALLEL TO THE CURB. Palm fronds, branches, shrubs, and stumps. Items should **NOT** exceed 6 feet in length and 50 pounds in weight.



3. SEPARATE. Garbage, recycling and yard waste must be separated by resident and placed **curbside by 6 a.m.** on the scheduled collection day.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

- Do not blow leaves and yard waste into the street and storm drains that empty into nearby waterways.
- Yard waste placed in front of a vacant lot, land, or property will not be collected.
- Items that are not considered as yard waste include: Whole trees, land clearing debris, fencing, landscape timbers, garden hoses, planters, flowerpots, and yard decorations.
