SCRIPTURE READING

Responsive Reading: Psalm 22:1-15

- (L)My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?
- (ALL) O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night but find no rest.
- (L) Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel.
- (ALL) In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.
- (L) To you they cried, and were saved; in you they trusted, and were not put to shame.
- (ALL)But I am a worm, and not human; scorned by others, and despised by the people.
- (L)All who see me mock at me; they make mouths at me; they shake their heads;
- (ALL)"Commit your cause to the Lord; let him deliver— let him rescue the one in whom he delights!"
- (L) Yet it was you who took me from the womb; you kept me safe on my mother's breast.
- (ALL) On you I was cast from my birth, and since my mother bore me, you have been my God.
- (L) Do not be far from me, for trouble is near and there is no one to help.
- (ALL) Many bulls encircle me, strong bulls of Bashan surround me; they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion.
- (L) I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast; my mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.

Old Testament Reading: Ezekiel 37:1-14

- <u>1</u> The hand of the Lord came upon me, and he brought me out by the spirit of the Lord and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones.
- <u>2</u> He led me all around them; there were very many lying in the valley, and they were very dry.
- 3 He said to me, "Mortal, can these bones live?" I answered, "O Lord God, you know."
- 4 Then he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones, and say to them: O dry bones, hear the word of the Lord.
- <u>5</u> Thus says the Lord God to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live.
- <u>6</u> I will lay sinews on you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live; and you shall know that I am the Lord."
- <u>7</u> So I prophesied as I had been commanded; and as I prophesied, suddenly there was a noise, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone.
- <u>8</u> I looked, and there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them; but there was no breath in them.

- <u>9</u> Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath, prophesy, mortal, and say to the breath: Thus says the Lord God: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe upon these slain, that they may live."
- <u>10</u> I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived, and stood on their feet, a vast multitude.
- 11 Then he said to me, "Mortal, these bones are the whole house of Israel. They say, "Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are cut off completely.'
- 12 Therefore prophesy, and say to them, Thus says the Lord God: I am going to open your graves, and bring you up from your graves, O my people; and I will bring you back to the land of Israel.
- 13 And you shall know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves, and bring you up from your graves, O my people.
- 14 I will put my spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you on your own soil; then you shall know that I, the Lord, have spoken and will act, says the Lord."
