THE DOXOLOGY | APOLOGETIC CORNER

Worship in Focus: The Doxology

Part 5 in our Series on the Elements of Worship

If you've spent much time in a worship service, chances are you've sung these familiar words:

Praise God, from whom all blessings flow; Praise Him, all creatures here below; Praise Him above, ye heavenly host; Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. Amen.

This short hymn, known simply as **The Doxology**, was written by Anglican priest Thomas Ken in 1674 as a closing stanza for three of his daily hymns. Over time, it has become one of the most universally recognized and enduring elements of Christian worship. Though it is often sung after the offering, The Doxology's depth and versatility make it fitting in many parts of a service—following Scripture readings, preceding a benediction, or even opening the service with an immediate call to praise.

The word *doxology* comes from the Greek *doxa* (glory) and *logos* (word). At its core, a doxology is a word of glory—a verbal outpouring of praise to God. Throughout church history, short hymns of praise have marked moments of worship and devotion, summing up theological truths in lyrical form. Doxologies like the Gloria Patri ("Glory be to the Father...") and the Gloria in Excelsis Deo ("Glory to God in the highest...") have echoed through cathedrals and country churches alike, lifting hearts and voices in unified, joyful declaration.

Why has The Doxology held such a central place in our worship? Because it reminds us, succinctly and powerfully, of several foundational truths:

- God is the source of every blessing (James 1:17).
- All creation is called to worship Him (Psalm 150:6).
- **He is eternally worthy of glory** (Romans 11:36).
- He exists in triune majesty—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19).

Far from being a mere ritual or placeholder, The Doxology expresses our deepest theological convictions. When we sing it, we join with centuries of believers who have lifted these same words to the Lord. At the same time, we give fresh voice to timeless praise, allowing the Spirit to awaken gratitude, awe, and wonder in our hearts.

As with all elements of our worship, The Doxology helps us proclaim the gospel. It teaches us to lift our eyes from ourselves to the God who blesses, redeems, and reigns. Its placement in the service—whether after the offering, before a benediction, or in response to the Word—serves as a moment of doxological clarity: *God deserves all praise*, now and forever.

Next month, we'll conclude this series by exploring **The Benediction**, the sending blessing that assures us of God's grace as we go into the world. Until then, may the doxology on our lips reflect the doxology in our hearts: "To Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen" (Ephesians 3:21).

DORA TARTAR

RHUBARB PIE

1 UNBAKED PIE CRUST

2 EGGS

3 TBSP. FLOUR

1-1/2 CUPS SUGAR

4 CUPS RHUBARB, CUT INTO 1 INCH PIECES

DASH OF CINNAMON

1/2 CUP WHITE RAISINS (OPTIONAL)

TOSS THE RHUBARB, EGGS, FLOUR AND SUGAR TOGETHER UNTIL IT GETS NICE AND JUICY. POUR INTO THE PIE SHELL AND SPRINNKLE WITH CINNAMON. BAKE AT 425 DEGREES FOR 10 MINUTES, THEN TURN THE OVEN TO 375 DEGREES AND BAKE UNTIL NICE AND FIRM. APPROXIMATELY 30 TO 35 MINUTES MORE. ALLOW TO COOL BEFORE SERVING.



This recipe is a blast from my past for a couple of reasons. First, it was one of my favorite desserts that my Mom made. Second, because this came from The Western Pocono Community Library Cookbook published in 1992 when I was still working at Pleasant Valley School District.
