BYLAW CHANGE

In view of the fact that St. Matthew's is now an Evangelical Congregational Church, it is important that the process of calling a new pastor is in line with the Conference Rules set forth in the E.C.C.

The process for the placement of pastors in the Evangelical Congregational Church differs from the former United Church of Christ model.

In the Evangelical Congregational Church "Pastors are assigned by a Stationing Committee through a cooperative process (Stationing Committee, pastor and local church) rather than called to pulpit ministries by a local congregation" (901 Defining Stationing... National Conference Rules) The Stationing Committee, which is made up of elected leaders and the Bishop of the Conference, works with the search committee to find the pastor who is a good fit in regards to the church profile and needs. The Church Search Committee carries the responsibility of vetting the candidate put forward by the stationing committee, and ultimately making the final decision to call the new pastor.

Following is the proposed bylaws change which is to be voted on **Sunday Morning**, **May 18**, **immediately following the 9:00am worship service**.

The old / current bylaws wording for Article 7, Section 3 is shown in strike out and the new change is shown in bold italics.

Article 7. The Call of the Pastor and the Termination of a Pastorate.

Section 3. The Pastoral Search Committee, with the approval of the Church Council, shall present a candidate to the congregation that it feels can fill the office of Pastor. To receive the Call as Pastor the candidate shall receive a favorable vote cast by communicant members at the meeting that follows the worship service. The Conference Minister shall determine if vote cast is favorable:

The St. Matthew's Pastoral Search Committee shall operate in accordance with the National E. C. Conference rules (900 Stationing of Ministers) during the pastoral selection process. Pastors are assigned by an E.C. Stationing Committee, which is made-up of elected leaders of the National Conference and the Bishop. "The Stationing Committee shall give careful consideration to past performances and the gifts and graces of the men involved, as well as the needs of the local churches to be stationed." (901 Defining Stationing) The Stationing Committee will present one candidate at a time for the St. Matthew's Pastoral Search Committee's consideration and the Pastoral Search Committee's subsequent unanimous vote following assessments and interviews. The final decision on the new pastor for St. Matthew's E.C. Church will be made solely by the St. Matthew's Pastoral Search Committee.

THE CALL TO WORSHIP | APOLOGETIC CORNER

Numerous times I have been asked about the purpose of various elements of the weekly worship service, such as the Call to Worship, Affirmation of Faith, Confession, Assurance of Pardon, and Doxology. I thought it would be helpful to explore each of these practices in the coming months, with the goal of deepening worshipers' understanding and appreciation for the different parts of the Sunday morning worship service. This month, I will focus on the opening Call to Worship.

We read in Psalm 100... Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth. Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs. Know that the LORD is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. For the LORD is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

This psalm calls people to joyful worship and gratitude toward God, recognizing Him as the Creator and Sustainer of life. The purpose of the Call to Worship is to direct our attention away from worldly distractions and focus our hearts on revering God, inviting and guiding God's people in worship.

God calls us to worship: Worship is initiated by God, not by humans. The Call to Worship is a divine invitation, and our response to it is both a serious responsibility and a joyful privilege. It should never be reduced to casual greetings or trivial distractions, as it is a solemn moment for focusing on God. Through the Call to Worship, God invites us into His presence, inviting us to join the eternal praise of the heavenly hosts. The worship leader should express this invitation with enthusiasm and joy, recognizing the significance of the moment. A well-planned Call to Worship also aligns with the theme of the service, setting the tone for the rest of the service and guiding the congregation's response to worship.

God calls us to respond to His revelation: The Call to Worship urges God's people to respond to His revelation of His nature and purposes. Worship is a response to God on His terms, not our own. This response includes praise, prayer, repentance, testimony, encouragement, and service, forming the foundation of covenant worship. Psalm 100 reveals God as Lord and Creator, prompting us to respond with thanksgiving and praise. The Call to Worship carries an imperative tone, meaning it expresses a command or urgent request, prompting the congregation to actively engage rather than simply listen passively.

God calls us to respond to His redemption: God's invitation to worship reminds us that, despite our weaknesses and sins, we are precious to Him. His invitation reveals His grace, making us willing and able to respond in worship. The psalmist emphasizes that we are God's people, and our worship is motivated by God's goodness, love, and faithfulness, which are all reasons for praise. While the full message of the gospel may not always be explicitly stated in the Call to Worship, its essence is reflected in the invitation to approach God's presence. This invitation honors His worthiness while comforting us in our unworthiness. God's grace not only establishes our relationship with Him but compels us to respond in worship. In the Call to Worship, God acts as both host and honoree, welcoming us into His presence.

In conclusion, the Call to Worship is a sacred invitation from God, drawing us into His presence and prompting praise and reverence. It sets the tone for the entire service, guiding our hearts toward God. As worship leaders and participants, we are called to approach this time with joy, recognizing its privilege and responsibility. In the coming months, I look forward to exploring other elements of the worship service, with the goal of deepening our understanding and enriching our worship experience.
