## THE CONFESSION OF SIN | APOLOGETIC CORNER

Worship in Focus: The Confession of Sin

Part 3 in our Series on the Elements of Worship

As we continue our series on the elements of the Sunday morning worship service, following our exploration of "The Call to Worship" and "The Affirmation of Faith," this month we focus on the *Confession of Sin*. For many modern ears, this might seem like an unappealing or even off-putting practice. In a world where self-esteem is king and hard truths are often softened or avoided, why would a church intentionally make space in its worship to confront sin?

The answer is simple but profound: without acknowledging our sin, we cannot truly understand or rejoice in the grace of God. Confession is not about groveling or earning forgiveness—it is about coming to God as we are, with honesty and humility, knowing that His mercy is already ours through Christ. As the Apostle Paul reminds us, "God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance" (Romans 2:4). Confession is not the precondition of grace—it is the response to it.

Throughout Scripture and church history, confession has always had a vital role in the life of God's people. From the prayers of Ezra, Solomon, and the Levites, to the reformers like Martin Bucer and John Calvin who shaped our liturgical heritage, God's people have understood that naming our sin is essential to experiencing gospel renewal. When we confess, we are not seeking to impress God with our sorrow. We are allowing the Spirit to soften our hearts and lead us back to the cross.

Practically, this time in worship may take different forms—corporate prayers spoken in unison, reflective moments of silence, or extemporaneous prayers led from the pulpit. Regardless of the method, the aim is always the same: to help God's people acknowledge the truth of their condition and run anew to the mercy of Christ. As John Newton famously wrote, "Amazing grace! how sweet the sound, That saved a wretch; like me!" The wretchedness is not the focus, but it gives meaning to the amazing.

## Confession of Sin

Most merciful God,
we confess that we have sinned against you
in thought, word, and deed,
by what we have done,
and by what we have left undone.
We have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
have mercy on us and forgive us;
that we may delight in your will,
and walk in your ways,
to the glory of your Name. Amen.

The Book of Common Prayer

The confession often follows the opening praise in our service, a natural movement from the glory of God to the humility of our own hearts. But confession is never isolated—it is always tethered to the assurance of pardon that follows (which we'll explore next month). We confess not to wallow, but to be lifted by grace. We repent not to earn love, but because we are already loved.

In this way, *The Confession of Sin* shapes us into people who know the truth about ourselves—and more importantly, the truth about the gospel. It is a moment of honesty, of hope, and of heartfelt return to the God who forgives not because we confess well, but because Christ was forsaken for us.

Let us approach this part of worship not with dread, but with gratitude—and with hearts ready to be reminded of the mercy that is already ours.
