THE READING OF SCRIPTURE

The Old Testament Lesson: Isaiah 40: 1-11

1 Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. 2 Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. 3 A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. 4 Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. 5 Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken."



(The top layer peals off to reveal the small wafer and the second layer peals off to reveal the juice). When the pastor eats the bread, please eat yours and when she drinks the cup, please do the same. This is the Lord's Table; all are welcome to join the feast.

Transmission of COVID19 is on the rise in our area. Don't forget to wear a mask at all times when inside the building and to keep 6 feet away from others not in your household! If you are not feeling well or running a fever, please stay home. Thank you for helping to keep each other safe.

We will have a "Blue Christmas" Service on Monday, December 14 at 7 pm for all those who are grieving or having a difficult time finding joy this Advent/Christmas season. It will be a service of prayer, candles, and communion. We will worship in the Gathering Room.

Christmas Eve Plans: Currently, we are planning on having four Christmas Eve Services—3, 5, 7, 10 pm. We hope everyone who would like to attend a Christmas Eve service will be able to come to one of those services and be able to be seated in the sanctuary. *We ask that you call the church office and make a reservation*. We can only allow a maximum of 57 people in the sanctuary for each



service—and that includes all participants. By Christmas Eve, our TV's should all be able to live stream for overflow. We ask that you reserve your spot in the sanctuary for one service only. These are the current plans—if we have to go to online worship, we will have a virtual 5 pm (lessons, carols, and candlelight) and 7 pm (country gospel) service. All services will have communion so don't forget to bring bread and wine (juice).

Council is considering sponsoring a New Year's Eve Party in the Grove for our church family with campfires, a Watchnight Worship Service, refreshments, and possible line dancing.
