

DOES TRUTH EXIST?

Currently, I am taking a course based on Frank Turek's book "I Don't Have Enough Faith to Be an Atheist." Over the next few months, I am going to share with you some of the things I learned. The first week of the course addresses the question "Does Truth Exist?"

Suppose someone came up to you and said, "There is no truth." The question you should ask in response to that statement is, "Is that true?" This is what we refer to as a self-defeating statement. A self-defeating statement doesn't meet its own standards because it violates one of the fundamental laws of logic that we call the law of noncontradiction. This law says that opposite ideas cannot both be true at the same time and in the same sense.

Identifying and being able to defuse any self-defeating statements is an important tool. It simply requires being able to effectively turn the claim back on itself. This is important because these types of claims are all around us, especially on social media.

For example, consider the statement, "There's no such thing as absolute truth."

What question could be asked if you turned this claim on itself? How about, Are you absolutely sure? Another way this claim is often stated is by saying, "All truth is relative." Turning this around you could respond with, Is that a relative truth? Take notice of how quickly these claims defeat themselves.

These claims often manifest today with the statement "There isn't THE truth, only MY truth!" But is this true? Is it possible that everyone can simply live out their own truth and still get along? The question we should respond with when we hear this common claim is, Is that just YOUR truth or THE truth? Please note, if it is just your personal opinion then there is no sense in me entertaining it. But if you're saying it is THE truth, then you are defeating yourself with the statement.

While unpopular to say in culture today, it is accurate to say there is no such thing as **YOUR truth** or **MY truth**, there's just <u>THE truth</u>. While it might be a popular thing to say, it is not the way the world works. Saying you have your own truth is equivalent to saying you have your own math.

As believers, we already have an understanding of THE truth because the Lord proclaims that **He is the way, THE TRUTH, and the life.** (John 14:6). May THE TRUTH contained in the pages of Scripture guide us every day.

TURTLE BARS

RENEE KEIPER

Turtle Bars are a sweet, crunch combination of a shortbread crust, homemade caramel and pecans all topped in chocolate. The ultimate easy homemade candy!

Makes 16 bars.

Shortbread base:

2 cups flour 1 cup packed brown sugar 3/4 cup unsalted butter, softened

Turtle layer:

1 cup unsalted butter 1 cup packed brown sugar 1/4 cup heavy cream

1/4 tsp salt 2 cups chopped pecans 12 ounces semi-sweet choc. chips

Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and spray a 13 x 9" baking dish with baking spray.

- 2. Add flour, 1 cup brown sugar and 3/4 cup butter to a stand mixer on medium speed until crumbly.
- 3. Press into the baking dish evenly.
- 4. Add 1 cup butter, 1 cup brown sugar, heavy cream and 1/4 tsp salt to a medium saucepan on medium heat.
- 5. Stir non-stop until mixture comes to a boil, then cook for 1 additional minute.
- 6. Remove from heat and pour mixture over the cookie base.
- 7. Sprinkle pecans over the caramel.
- 8. Bake for 18-20 minutes.
- 9. Sprinkle chocolate chips over the baked bars as soon as they come out of the oven and let sit for 5 minutes to melt (you can cover the pan with a baking sheet to keep the heat in)
- 10. Spread chocolate carefully with spatula or fork.
- 11. Cool completely before slicing and serving.
- 12. ENJOY!!!!!
