

For me, April is the month of celebration of my mom's and daughter's shared birthdays on April 25. Mom will be 90! Becky, my baby, will be

44!!! For the past 22 years, April would be a very busy month for CIA as we prepared for our annual Ladies' Spring Fling. But Covid 19 cancelled us out last year and will do so this year. So our crafting hands and acting "skills" have been put "on pause," for now. But the friendships we have forged over these many years remain as strong as ever. These gals hold a very special place in my heart. That's why I affectionately call them, "My Lovely Bunch of Coconuts," because when we get together we're all a little nutty.

I like the following Bible verse to describe the friendships we have.

Ecclesiastes 4:9 says, "Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow...And though a man (or woman) might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him—a threefold cord is not quickly broken."

Boy, that is so true with my lovely bunch of coconuts and me. When we work on putting a Spring Fling together, or our fund raisers, or a mission project, we learn that we can't do any of it alone. We need each other to make the task at hand a success. And we always have a good time while doing it! Laughter is a required ingredient to everything we do! It also helps knowing God is guiding us through everything we do.

So I picked Coconut Cake for my recipe for the month of April. It honors all my lovely bunch of coconuts and I make this cake for my mom's birthdays and Easter dessert. If you make it, think of your own "bunch of lovely coconuts," whether they be dear friends or beloved family and enjoy!

### COCONUT CAKE

(This can be made in a two-layer 9 inch cake or a 9 x 13 inch pan.)

2 cups flour 2 cups sugar <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup oil 1 cup milk

4 eggs (separated) 2 tsp. baking powder

<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup coconut 1 tsp. vanilla

Separate eggs. Place egg whites in a bowl and beat until stiff. In a separate bowl, beat egg yolks with oil and sugar.

Combine flour and baking powder. Add to egg/oil/sugar mix. Add milk, vanilla and coconut.

Fold in stiff egg whites. Pour batter in two greased/floured 9" cake pans or a 9 x 13 inch pan and bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until tooth pick comes out dry. When cool, frost.

### **FROSTING**

1 cup milk 1 pkg. vanilla instant pudding ½ cup powdered sugar 1 (8 oz.) tub of Cool Whip 1/4-1/2 cup coconut

Pour milk into a bowl, add powdered sugar and pudding. Beat for 2 minutes. Stir in Cool Whip and then refrigerate for 15 minutes. Then frost cake. Sprinkle coconut on top.

(For an Easter dessert, I put about 1/4-1/2 cup of coconut in a dish and add a couple of drops of green food coloring and mix until coated. Then I sprinkle it on top of cake and add a few jelly beans or pastel Easter egg-shaped candies on top (like Peanut M&Ms.)


