

Dear Members and Friends of St. Matthews.

Lent has begun. Lent is a 40-day journey that begins with ashes and a reminder of who we are and whose we are. The season ends at the foot of the cross and with a borrowed tomb. Along the way we take a journey together. It is a time of repentance, prayer and worship as we prepare to remember the events of Good Friday so we can truly give thanks and celebrate the joy of the resurrection. There are many ways to observe the season of Lent. Some people give up something each year for the 6



weeks—a kind of fast. This could be a favorite food or a favorite past time. Others prefer to add something to their spiritual devotion throughout Lent—bible study, longer prayer and devotional time, volunteer work or more generous giving. You can also add to your worship life this Lent by joining us for worship on Wednesday evenings. Each year, St. Matthew's joins with four other churches in our area to worship and fellowship together on Wednesday evenings. This year, our theme is the Signs of Lent.

This series of 5 worship services for Lent is based on the concept of road signs and how their messages apply to our life in Christ during the season of Lent: Stop, Merge, Yield, One Way, and Dead End. Like signs we see along the roads that tell us what to do, we see signs along the way on our Lenten journey that show us the way to Christ. In our Lenten worship on March 4, we remember how Peter tried to put a Stop sign in front of Jesus on his way to the cross. But Jesus helped him (and us) to see that he could only stop when he reached the cross to save us all.

On March 11, our second Wednesday night service, we will be reminded to merge our lives with the long history of the story of salvation that began in the Garden of Eden, continued with the Children of Israel at Passover and is revealed in the sacrifice of the promised Messiah. Then during our third time together on March 18, we will be reminded to yield to God's will for us in our lives, just as Jesus yielded to his will when he prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Not my will, but yours be done." On March 25, our road sign is the One-Way sign, reminding us that Jesus and his journey to the cross is a one-way path for all of us to God's Kingdom. Lastly, on April 1 (no fooling), our Lenten worship this week, will remind us that, unlike other paths in life, Jesus is not a dead end, but a start to life everlasting.

I hope you will join with us this Lenten season as we worship and grow together on our journey through Lent.

May you observe a holy and acceptable Lent.


Of rocks and repentance
