

Hello, September! I hope everyone enjoyed their summer and had the opportunity to do many fun things.



Sunday School will be virtual this Fall and Winter. We will have one class for preschool through fifth grade students. Our teachers are Dora Tartar, Connie Moretz, Jessica Slawter, Gabby Bentley, Diann Bittenbender and myself. We will rotate so you will see us in the Weekly Welcome video once every six weeks. Pastor Suzanne Brooks-Cope and Norm Burger will teach the Confirmation class -6^{th} grade and up - are planning their class schedule with parents' input.

Our website will be updated Saturday evenings and your child can do class Sunday morning or at any time. Our Rally Day kickoff is on September 13. Join us for 9 a.m. worship in the grove. The children may sit on the carpet squares spread out in front of the gazebo. During my children's message, I will introduce the teachers. I will have a few beach balls they can kick off to begin a new year of Bible lessons and activities.


Our monthly Friday Fun Nights will be held in the grove from 5 to 8 p.m. Parents are encouraged to stay with their kids.

We will dance to the Monster Mash and other songs. We will play low contact games like pin the nose on the witch. We will make hot dogs and s'mores on the campfire. It will be a howling good time. Rain date: Sunday, November 1 from 10:30 a.m. to noon.
- * November 27: "Merry Movie Night". Weather permitting, we will watch a Christmas movie and kickoff the holiday season.
