IT'S A MAD, MAD, MAD, MAD WORLD By Pastor Rick

The movie *It's a Mad, Mad, Mad, Mad World* came out in 1963. It starred Spencer Tracy as well as numerous well-known comedic actors of the era such as Buddy Hackett, Johnathan Winters, and Milton Berle — just to name a few. All of the actors in the movie are frantically trying to be the first to discover a boat load of money buried in the San Rosita park under a big W. After watching three hours of mishaps, car crashes, car chases, and much yelling and hollering, one can only conclude it's truly a maniacal mad, mad world. Is the world in which we live so different? Our lives are packed full of tight schedules and continuous motion, so many "talking heads," interruptions and distractions, so much so that we concur this is a mad, mad world.

So where do we find rest in our over-committed and over-scheduled existence? Where do we find rest when it seems like our lives are going 100 miles an hour and being pulled in a myriad of different directions? The answer is found in Psalm 62. It is there that the Psalmist writes, "My soul finds rest in God alone; my salvation comes from him. He alone is my rock and my salvation; he is my fortress, I shall never be shaken." (Psalm 62:1-2)

King David knew something that we all must discover. Rest is possible, but only in God alone. Rest is not found in any other thing, or any other person, or any better circumstance. We think we can find it elsewhere: in our job success, in our corporate ladder-climbing, in our family activities, in our marriage, in our leisure, and even in our activities at church.

The rest that the Psalmist writes about is not the absence of a hectic existence. The rest he talks about is a supernatural peace that can only come from one place, which is the person of Father God. It is in God that we discover the ultimate place of peace, contentment, confidence, and rest. There is no striving. There's not a sense that one has to perform and measure up for success.

Psalm 46 instructs us to "be still and know that He is God." Being still means that I let go. I stop trying to make it happen in my own strength and instead I trust God.

So many times we think, "If I can only make my circumstances better, then I will have contentment. If I could only make enough money, or have a better house, or secure a better job . . . if only I can get to retirement, then I can get some rest."

My soul finds rest in God alone. Anything else is an exercise in futility.

If you sense that life is chaotic and you are coming to the end of your rope, take a moment and call out to the Lord. Spend time in God's presence. Worship Him with thankfulness and you will experience the rest that He can give.

JOURNEY TOWARD SPIRITUAL MATURITY | APOLOGETIC CORNER

In Ephesians 4:13 we read, "until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God **and become mature**, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ."

As young believers, this verse is calling us to embark upon a spiritual growth journey that will take us from adolescence (level A) on to maturity (level B). This is a process we continue to refine throughout our lives. Attaining the full measure of Christ can sometimes be challenging and frustrating.

In his book *The Three Colors of Your Spirituality*, author Christian A. Schwartz defines these two levels of maturity in the following ways:

Level A focuses on identifying and developing one's strengths, creating a sense of security, stability, and grounding. It emphasizes a spirituality of "dwelling," where individuals feel at home and centered in their relationship with God. At this stage, the focus is on personal identity, building spiritual self-esteem, and operating within one's comfort zone. Level A is about spiritual formation, where individuals intensify and deepen their existing spiritual experiences. The goal is not to leave this stage entirely, but to mature within it, integrating elements of other spiritual styles to address areas of weakness or underdevelopment.

Level B spirituality represents a deeper level of spiritual maturity that goes beyond the easy, gratifying experiences of Level A. It involves a lifelong journey of growth that is slower and often more challenging, requiring individuals to confront both their strengths and weaknesses. Unlike Level A, which offers a sense of security and comfort, Level B demands greater complexity, discomfort, and vulnerability. Spiritual maturity in Level B is not immediately gratifying and may bring subtle progress, but it requires the courage to face ambiguity, complexity, and personal sin. Overcoming the misconception that spiritual growth is always a positive experience without challenges is key, as both the positive and negative aspects of one's spirituality are necessary for full growth.

So, what is the best way to begin the journey toward spiritual maturity? If you've been reading my newsletter articles over the past few months, you've already begun thinking about passionate spirituality, and I want to encourage you to continue on this path. There is a Spiritual Style Test developed by Christian A. Schwarz, designed to help individuals identify their native spiritual style. Once we understand your native style, we can identify areas for growth.

You can complete the Spiritual Style Test by filling out an online form I created. This will allow me to determine where you fall on the Spiritual Style spectrum. There are no right or wrong answers, so don't feel intimidated. Instead, I encourage you to get excited about this opportunity. I found the information to be very eye-opening and beneficial in my own spiritual journey, as it has helped me gain a deeper understanding of my own strengths and weaknesses.

I will be offering two opportunities for people to take the Spiritual Style Test and learn possible ways to grow and become more spiritually mature. You can join us on **Sunday, May 4th** (after church in the CIA room) or **Wednesday, May 7th** at 6:30 PM. I look forward to seeing you there and will have materials prepared to support you on this exciting journey of growth toward spiritual maturity.

CIA COOK'S CORNER PASTA SALAD STELLA JEAN CHRISTIANSEN

8 oz. pasta—medium shells

1/2 cup basil pesto

1/2 cup sun dried tomatoes (drain the oil) cut into bite size pieces

1 lb. asparagus

1/3 cup mozzarella cut in cubes

2 tbsp olive oil

Salt and pepper

Bake asparagus in the oven on a cookie sheet at 425 degrees for 10-12 minutes.

Coat the baked asparagus with 2tbs olive oil, salt and pepper by placing it in a plastic bag and shaking until all spears are coated. Then cut into bite size pieces.

Cook pasta according to directions and drain well.

Add all ingredients together and mix.
