3 Year - Level 7 - Bachelors Degree

The Bachelor of Applied Management has a strong focus on innovation and business development preparing graduates to be industry leaders. It focuses on developing not only theoretical knowledge but also the strategic capabilities required of a leader.

All our degree programs have core humanities papers embedded in them giving our graduates not only strong technical expertise but also developing the as well rounded members of society.

Year three learners are taught how to prepare and manage a project and will have the opportunity to develop their own project ideas alongside industry. Learners also have the choice to undertake an industry based research project.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

English language:

You must have IELTS 6 or equivalent with no band less than 5.5.

Academic:

You must be over 18 years of age and hold a National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) 3 or equivalent (completed year 12).

Learners learn how to communicate effectively as a manager across cultures and gain an understanding of how organisational behaviour impacts on management and business continuity.

Small Business and New Enterprise Development

Learners learn all aspects of developing new enterprises and small businesses.

Year two subjects

Anthropology

Bachelor of Applied Art

3 Year – Level 7 – Bachelors Degree in Film or Digital Media Production

The Bachelor of Applied Arts has two streams, Film production or Digital Media Production. While basic skills will be taught, both streams focus on graduating industry ready producers.

All our degree programs have core humanities papers embedded in them giving our graduates not only strong technical expertise but also developing the as well rounded members of society.

Year three learners are taught how to engage in the pre-production of a project of their own design and have the opportunity to go on and produce their own project or to undertake and industry based internship.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

English language:

You must have IELTS 6 or equivalent with no band less than 5.5.

Academic:

You must be over 18 years of age and hold a National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) 3 or equivalent (completed year 12).

Learners choose one of the following

Capstone Project

Learners produce the project from Semester one.

Capstone Internship

Learners undertake an internship in industry.

HOW TO APPLY

- Choose your programme and check if you meet the academic and English language entry requirements.
- Fill out an application form or request your advisor to do so.

- Once your application is complete and we have received all necessary documentation from your advisor, it will be assessed by our staff
- If your application is successful we will issue you an offer of place. Accept your offer of place by following the instructions in your offer letter.
- Apply for a learner visa at Immigration New Zealand (INZ).
- Once your Approval in Principle (AIP) is issued by INZ, you will need to pay your tuition fees, then obtain health and travel insurance through us before leaving your country.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

In addition to your tuition fees, you will need to pay for textbooks and your personal expenses. If you enter New Zealand on a student visa, Immigration New Zealand requires you to have access to NZ\$20,000 in addition to your course fees for each year you will be studying in New Zealand, plus an additional NZ\$2,000 to cover a return ticket home.

Full details of immigration requirements, advice on rights to employment in New Zealand while studying, and reporting requirements are available from Immigration New Zealand's website at www.immigration.govt.nz

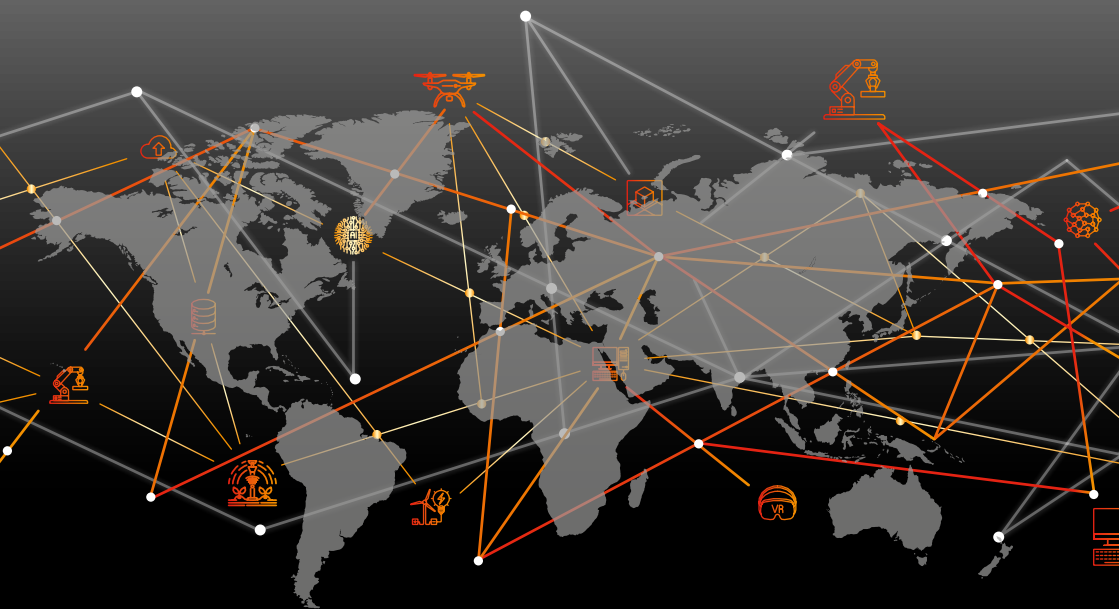
