Equipping and Empowering Laity is at the Core of the Revitalization Underway at First UMC Watauga



Fresh paint and new carpet in the church nursery and improved lighting in the parking lot are some of the immediately visible parts of a revitaliza-

tion project underway at First UMC of Watauga. But those outwardly obvious updates are just part of the story. The core of the revitalization efforts are the initiatives now in place to more fully equip and empower laypersons as they seek to make disciples of Jesus Christ.

Rev. Sheila Fiorella, in her second year as pastor, is excited about the changes she's seeing within the church. "We just started experimenting," she said. "I shared with the leadership team that my priorities were Christ, worship and evangelism."

A renewed focus on young people is part of the disciple making revitalization efforts underway at First Watauga. As this photo shows, sometimes you have to crawl inside your bubble to engage in some out of the box transformation.

Sheila said she encourages church members to "start new adventures, following the call God has placed on their hearts."

The church has launched a New Day Worship Experience on Wednesday evenings and has begun to air

some of its worship services on Facebook Live. New fellowship opportunities are also offered, including women's luncheons designed for worship, support and encouragement, plus a young adult ministry established by one of the young adults in the congregation. The church also seeks to partner with the school district and Texas Health Resources to address mental and behavioral health issues within the community.

The CTC's WIG of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world is in full force at First Watauga for God is on the move and at work in the church, Sheila said. "Pleasing God is our motivation, as well as leading new people to the Christ we know and love."

A Message from Our Pastor

First United Methodist Church of Watauga (FUMCOW) A Safe Space Where Everyone Knows Your Name

What does that mean? A "Safe Space?" I first referred to the church being a safe space when I was officiating at the funeral of a man who had grown up in our church and whose parents still attend. There was a packed Sanctuary, filled with his many friends, some of whom do not attend church. This does not mean that they are not Christian. In fact, their displays of love and words of affection for the young man who died and for each other were very Christ-like indeed.

Many, MANY friends came forward to speak. Some used language that you usually don't hear on a Sunday morning. I assured them, "That's alright. This is a safe space. You can be real."

Isn't that what we all want, if we're honest? Real, authentic relationships that we can have with God and with one another. To know that we're not being judged for our words, our skin color, the number of tattoos and/or piercings we have (there were many in the room that day) or don't have. To know that we can be vulnerable with one another. To be known, warts and all, and still be loved.

Jesus created that safe space wherever he went. Whether it was the synagogue, the Temple, the leper colony, or the red-light district, Jesus allowed people to be themselves, free of condemnation. He looked at them, as he looks at us, as God's children, deeply loved by our Loving Parent who surrounds us. He didn't expect us to clean up. Didn't expect all our rough edges to be smooth. Jesus simply loved, and laughed, and even cried with those who followed him.

It was interesting to me that day that the young men who attended the funeral all wore suits and ties, a sign of respect for coming into the house of God. Those of us who are regular members of the congregation were much more casual. But that's what is so neat about our relationship with Christ. We can come to him dressed in our Sunday best, or dressed in filthy rags. We can come to him as a registered Democrat, Republican, Independent or with no political party affiliation at all. We can come to him as a Progressive, Centrist, or Traditionalist. We can come to Jesus with 6 figures on our paycheck or with a Social Security check with 3 digits.

Still, the offer is to all. "Come to me, all of you who are heavy-laden, and I will give you rest." "Ask, seek, knock, and I will open the door." "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him."

Our church is and will continue to be a Safe Space for all people to find Peace. To find Hope. To find Love. To find Faith. To find Christ.

Hope to see you Easter Sunday, April 21, at 7, 8:30, or 10:30 am! Why not recommend us to a friend who is seeking relationships where they can be real? Jesus will meet us all here.




We are in need of ushers.
