

A Message from Our Pastor

GOD CAN GUIDE US

In 1999, in the aftermath of the death of John Kennedy, Jr., amateur pilot Stephen Hedges wrote about the difficulty of flying a plane by instruments alone—an essential skill if you want to fly at night or in fog. It is easy for a pilot to fall into an uncontrolled bank and crash without this skill.

Hedges noted that during one instrument lesson, "I flew the headings and turns as instructed, but even with ten hours of instrument flying in my logbook, I was amazed at how quickly the plane slid into a banking turn if I diverted my attention for just a few moments. The first time it happened, a pang of panic shot through me, a momentary fear that made it even more difficult to comprehend what the plane was doing." But when he heard his teacher next to him calmly say, "Watch your bank," Hedges quickly leveled the plane.

Similarly, Christians can easily get distracted when going through the foggy times of life. Seeking guidance is as simple—and as difficult—as looking to the Lord. Christ is always there, leading us and guiding us to safe places. It's our job to listen and to watch for the Lord's advice.

The Bible says, "Mortals make elaborate plans, but Godhas the last word.... Humans are satisfied with whatever looks good; God probes for what *is* good." Proverbs 16:1-2 The Bible is our primary means for understanding God's will. God will guide us, but not force us. God will lead us, but not take away our free will. So how do we get guidance from the Bible?

Well, first of all, guidance doesn't come from putting our hands on its leather cover and gleaning wisdom by osmosis. Only by being familiar with the entire book—by studying individual passages and learning the overarching story—do we come to know the heart of God. Second, we hear from God through the Bible by asking the Holy Spirit to open our spiritual eyes. The Word is living and active, and its truth comes upon us mightily and unexpectedly from passages we thought we knew inside out, providing fresh insight to our specific situations.




