Illinois offers the hustle and bustle of downtown Chi-town in “the Loop” to a concrete slab road zigzagging across the prairie.


Roadside icons appear along the 300 miles of the Mother Road. Luring open road is the Begin Route 66 sign at 77 East Adams across from the Art Institute of Chicago. Official starting point is 122 S. Michigan Ave.



Route 66 Runs 2,448 Miles

Highway runs from Chicago, Illinois through Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona to Santa Monica, California. In 1964 the Rolling Stones recorded a version of Route 66 in their debut album.


