

# BOY'S DEATH DUE To an accident

CHARLEY SCHLENK OF FREE-PORT IS VICTIM.

# RELATIVES IN ROCKFORD

Son of Engineer Schlenk of Illinois Central Who Formerly Lived in This City—Machine Hits Ice Wagon,

(Special to The Morning Star.)

FREEPORT, Sept. 24.—Charley Schlenk, aged 15, son of Engineer Charles H. Schlenk of the Illinois Central, was instantly killed this evening while riding a motorcycle on Oak street, One of John Fosselman's ice wagons turned onto Oak street from John street. The motorcycle ran into it, the tongue of the wagon striking the boy's chest and caving it in.

John Flanagan, aged 13, son of Mrs. M. Flanagan, 112 Carroll street, who was riding on the rear seat of the motorcycle, was knocked unconscious but it is thought he was not seriously hurt.

Engineer Schlenk is a brother of George L. Schlenk, 142 Longwood street, and Leonard Schlenk, 407 N. Third street, Rockford, His son frequently visited his relatives in this city and he was regarded by all as having a bright future. The father formerly lived in Rockford, although he has been a resident of Freeport many years. The family lives in Liberty street, There is one daughter, Marie, sixteen years old.

Rockford relatives were notified by The Star last night of the sad death and they made preparations to go to Freeport.


# Mrs. Cruikshank

Death of an Aged Lady.

Mrs.Schlenk(Catherine Betzold), relic of the late George
Schlenk, died at six o'clock this morning, of old age, at the
residence of her son-in-law, Leonard Schmauss. Deceased was
94yrs old and a native of Schnaittach, Bavaria, Germany. She
came to this city with her husband and children 44 years
ago and was indeed an old settler.

Notwithstanding her extreme age, she retained her faculities
to the last and was a very smart woman. Until a few days ago
she was in excellent health but her læst illness was some
what sudden and she failed to rally and passed quietly
away.

Deceased lives two chaldren, 12 grandchildren, 3 great grand children. The funeral will be held on Wednesday at nine e clock at St. James Catholic Church. Rev. Father Flagherty officating.

### The Executive Heads.

Under this plan the present personnel of the office includes, in the executive division, William H. Hefferan. who was commissioned postmaster Jan. 24, Clement C. Schlenk, bookkeeper, promoted from a clerkship, and Fred Wheat, former assistant postmaster; who is, now executive clerk.

In the division of mails, Charles F. Brogunier is superintendent of mails. Albert J. Nyberg, former superintendent of the East Rockford station, is assistant superintendent of mails, and Robert C. Anderson and Fred C. Rikert are foremen, promoted from clerkships.

In the division of finance, John H. Tole, former postal cashier, is superintendent of finance, John D. Wortman, money order cashier, was promoted from a clerkship, George L. Schlenk is chief stamp clerk. John F. Murphy, superintendent of the East Rockford station, was transferred from the office of superintendent of delivery.

# George L. Schlenk

Services for Leonard George Schlenk, 85. 142 North Longwood street, a retired post office employe! who died yesterday in St. Anthony; hospital, will be held at 9 a. m. Monday at the home and at 9:30 a. m. at St. James pro-cathedral. Burial will be in St. Mary's cemetery. A rosary service will be held at 8 p. m. Sunday at the home. Arrangements were made at the Frank R. Pitzgerald funeral home, 626 West Jefferson street.

In ill health since last May, Mr. Schlenk was admitted to the hospital as a medical patient in July. He returned home Aug. 11 and was readmitted to the hospital. Aug. 20.

Believed to be the first mail carrier appointed here under civil service regulations. Mr. Schlenk received the appointment Oct. 15. 1893. He carried mail for the South Main street business district and later the Rockford college area until July 1, 1919, when he became a mail clerk.

Secretary of the local civil service board for a number of years, he remained a post office employe for 32 years. After his retirement 20 years ago, he operated an elevator at the old Forest City National bank building. He had not been active in recent years.

He was born Oct. 15, 1860, in Monroe Center, the son of Michael and Amelia Heinze Schlenk. His father died while he was a boy, and he came to Rockford to live with relatives.

Before his postal appointment, Mr. Schlenk was in the livery business. He married Mary A. Barrett here, May 26, 1883, and they moved to Freeport, Ill., where they lived four years. Since 1887, the family has lived in Rockford. Mrs. Schlenk died in 1934.

Mr. Schienk was a member of the Holy Name society of St. James church, a fourth degree member of the Knights of Columbus, of which he was past grand knight and former district deputy grand; knight, and a charter member of the local council and of the fourth degree assembly.

Survivors include a son. Clyde J..! Rockford: three daughters, Miss' Olleen Schlenk and Mrs. John Mc-Namara both of Rockford, and Staff Sgt. Doreen M. Schlenk, a WAC stationed at Fairfield, Cal.; six grandchildren, and a halfbrother, Oscar Tricglaff, St. Paul. Minn. A son, Clement, died previously.
