Mr. Wieseler gave the following dates of interest to the board: week of March 11 is Read Across America Celebration-Mrs. DesLauriers, March 12 is ag in the classroom for 5 & 6 grade, March 13 is Doland Elementary Title open house at 2:00 p.m. in HHH Auditorium, March 14 is Hillside Elementary incentive party and lunch, March 14th is end of 3rd quarter, March 15 and 18 is no school for spring break, March 21 is Doland All School Play matinee at 2:15 p.m., evening at 7:00 p.m., March 22 is regular school day, March 25 is k-12 fine arts night at 7:00 p.m. with Mrs. Smith, March 26 FFA community Night at 5:30 p.m. with Guest speaker to Pk-6 in afternoon, March 29 regular day of school (snow make up day), April 4 RD Athletic Awards 6:30 p.m, April 7-9 State FFA Convention in Brookings, April 11 Dr. Weiss opioid presentations to grades 7-12, April 11-12 is 6th grade field trip to Sioux Falls with Mrs. DesLauriers, April 1 & 2 is State FCCLA in Sioux Falls, and April 17 is State Agriscience.

Mr.Hulscher gave a board report on technology website is up and running, the new server has been installed and it went smoother than expected, abatement has been approved from Spink County on 417 Humphrey Drive, board member were given a facility drawing handout, Tentative Auction date of May 11, the end of third quarter will be Thursday, Driver's Education has 10 students have paid and signed up, NAEP is done, ELL/ACCESS testing done and shipped back, Smarter Balance testing will be mid to late April, Redfield-Doland Coop met with administration on March 8th, the coop had the following items with no football game in Doland, zero to very little practices in Doland, Redfield is looking at the benefit of the coop from their perspective. They don't know if it is work it for them. They are looking at cutting \$150,000 from their budget and they are looking at all avenues. The calendar for the 18-19 school year: 6 late starts (2-T, 2-Thur, 1 M, and 1 F) 5 days of regular school 2-M, 1 T, 1 W, 1 Th), 1 teacher in service day, with March 29 and May 3 as scheduled snow make up days, will make up 2 days of pre school on March 29 & May 3, Thank you's were shared from shooting sports, and Hulscher family, and the children's Theatre has been approved the first week March,

The current enrollment for the Doland School District is 159 for grades K-12 at all the attendance centers. The Doland Center is at 100 with no preschool included, Clark Colony is 14, Hillside Colony is 22, Hillside High School is 13, and Camrose Colony is 10. The projected enrollment for the district in the fall of 2019 is at 154 students. These projected enrollments do not included preschool students or any Hillside High School students.

The date of the annual school board election set for on April 09, 2019, Tuesday. The school district will NOT have an election. The board of education will appoint a board member later.

The 2019-2020 preliminary calendar was presented to the Board of Education. The calendar is being review with later approval.

Chairperson Noethlich appointed N. Noethlich to serve on the City of Doland Equalization Board. The Board will met on Monday, March 18, 2019, at Doland City Hall at 7:00 p.m.

Mr. Hulscher gave a brief update on the South Dakota Legislative session.

Mr. Hulscher gave information and updated timeline on the buildings.

Mr. Hulscher read a letter of resignation from Mrs. Lewis as Perkins fiscal agent for the Great Lakes Consortium. Action 19-171: Motion by Hansen, 2nd by Houghtaling to accept the resignation at the end of the 2018-2019 school year as Perkins fiscal agent. All ayes.

The Doland School District will have a snow make up days on March 29, 2019, and May 3, 2019, which are both Fridays.

The school has four credit cards with the Bank of the West. Mr. Hulscher, Mr. Wieseler, Mrs. Coats, and Miss Trautner currently are on the Doland School credit cards.

Action 19-175: Motion by Hansen, 2nd by Schneider, to approve the hiring of Mr. Jeremy Wieseler, as principal for the 2019-2020 school year. Salary to be determined at a later date. All ayes.

Action 19-176: Motion by Schneider, 2nd by Moes, to declare the list of 10 access points, and controller as surplus, with no value for the 10 access points and dispose of the access points properly. A list is on file in the business office. All ayes.

Action 19-177: Motion by Hansen, 2nd by Schneider, to advertise for the 2019-2020 school year for milk bids for the April board meeting. All ayes.

Action 19-178: Motion by Moes, 2nd by Hansen, to set the pay for Mrs. Megan Ulrich as the 2018-2019 driver's education instructor with the salary of \$1,925.00. All ayes.

The 2019-2020 preliminary budget has been started for the District with a copy given to the board of education members. The work will continue on the budget and the mean of funding for the district. The SD Legislative session is still working on means of funding.
