Superintendent's Report: Mr. Schmidt

<u>Staffing updates:</u> Elizabeth Schultze was offered the Para-Professional position and will start Monday September 19, 2022. Dakota State has been contacted regarding potential openings and candidates. <u>Social Studies Standards:</u> Mr. Schmidt shared that the SASD is not in favor of the proposed curriculum and shared examples. The Standards Board is meeting in Aberdeen on September 19, 2022.

<u>Vehicle Fleet:</u> The Blue suburban and Expedition need to be replaced soon and another minibus should be added to the fleet. **Action 23-028:** Motion by Felderman and 2nd by Moes to locate and purchase 2 used SUV type vehicles under \$50,000 and a minibus. All Aye.

<u>Bus/Van Cameras:</u> Information from Pro Vision was shared. The cost for 3 vehicles would be \$15,000. <u>Project updates:</u> TSP Engineers estimate for the locker room project upgrade is around \$650,000.

Business Manager's Report: Mrs. Wipf

The 20-21 Audit and 21-22 Annual report are finished. KSB Law hourly rates will be the same as last year's rates. Wipf suggested dishwasher at the house be replaced as it is leaking. We have looked into purchasing a large 3 door bulletin board display case with funds raised by the HS Business class. FCCLA would also like to purchase a matching 2 door bulletin board display case. Mrs. Wipf will be attending the Business Officials Conference in Pierre September 27-29, 2022.

<u>Current 2022-2023</u> enrollment for the district: Clark Colony is 14, Hillside Colony Elementary is 10 Hillside High School is 2, Camrose Colony is 12, and Doland Attendance center is 104 for a total of 142. This does not include preschool count of 23 students.
