Principals Report:

Mr. Wieseler reported that a Zoom meeting was set up to answer teachers's questions on the new K-12 math series and we are working on lining up osbservations with areas schools who are using Savvas EnVision Math to see how they have implimented in the class rooms. SignUpGenius worked well for PK-6th Parent/teacher confrences. Attendance was nearly 100% for Doland PK-6, Hillside, Camrose, and Clark Colonies. Studen Health screenings are being conducted. The Zoo Mobile from the Great Plains Zoo was postponed to December 3, 2021. Dates of upcoming activites were shared.

Business Manager's Report:

Mrs. Wipf gave a brief report of the business office activities during the month, facility use agreements have been received for CEF, Spink Co. Ext. Spink Co. 4H, and Spink Co. Shooting Sports and requested direction on National FFA travel expenses

Superintendent's Report:

Mr. Hulscher shared the first Nine Weeks is completed and the honor roll has been sent out. The Special Education Review has been completed. Doland meet compliance. The written analysis is coming in about 6 weeks. The new bus arrived today, November 15, 2021. Lois Ragatz plans to retire. Other current staffing needs are full or part time Para – professionals, substitute bus drivers, and assistant wrestling coach. Chuck Schuelke is not able to do the wrestling room project. Gray Construction's engineer, Larson Contracting, and a couple other contractors are looking at the project to ascertain if they are able to do the project. The materials and supplies are all attainable at the approximate cost of \$27,000. The initial bid for the labor was approximately \$8,000. It is going to cost more than \$8,000. Mr. Hulscher shared information from Mr. Ruth on a possible athletic coop with Lake Preston. The board of Ed would like to reach out to area schools. Mr. Hulscher attended the ASBSD Region meeting were school funding, teacher and non-teacher pay, workforce shortage, content standard process, school elections, medical cannabis, alternative instruction were among the topics addressed. Jim Holbeck, ASBSD, presentation will be Jan, or Feb, 2022, DEA is planning to purchase a "retirement bench" request permission to place the bench near the electrical box area. The flagpole has been ordered and will be installed at the entrance by the rock. Composite decking has been ordered to place around the heating cooling units on the east side of the school.

The current enrollment: The Doland School is 99, Clark Colony 17, Hillside Elementary 15, Hillside High School 2, and Camrose Colony 9. Total is 143. Preschool enrollment is 16
