Core Idea

Key Principles

1. Aspire Without Ego

Quick Filters for Decision-Making

Before acting, ask:

- Am I acting from ego or ambition?
- Does this serve growth, mastery, or learning?
- Am I reacting emotionally or strategically?
- Will this action help me or the larger mission?

Entrepreneur / Sales Leader Angle

- Stay humble with clients—listen before pitching.
- Learn from every failure, lost deal, or misstep.
- Focus on building systems and teams, not personal credit.
- Avoid ego-driven decisions that risk reputation or long-term gain.
