We here at Dial Help are still offering 24/7 support through our talk/text/chat crisis line. Our Safety Net Program (#SNP) provides follow-up calls or texts for connecting to resources and extra support. The #SNP is available for people who are dealing with suicide risk and addiction.

In the Copper Country, we're still providing victim services and advocacy, family support services, and coordination for the Baraga and Houghton/Keweenaw Communities That Care coalitions. 
