Soul ShopTM for Youth /College Workers is a one-day faith-based workshop to equip youth pastors, youth leaders, camp directors, camp counselors and anyone else who works with young people. The goal is to learn how to minister to those impacted by suicide. This workshop engages the question of how to cultivate a soul-safe culture wherever youth/college students are gathered. Special attention will focus on youth-specific issues of impulsivity, contagion, social media, mandated reporting and confidentiality. The workshop includes training in suicide awareness, in suicide as a community health crisis, and in upstream suicide prevention.


