CRISIS UNIT

The Safety Net Program continues helping people find treatment and offering ongoing phone and text support to stabilize each client's life situation.

This free service is available to anyone in the UP dealing with addiction, complex crisis, or suicide risk/bereavement.

VICTIM SERVICES

The Victim Services Department is seeking Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANEs), as well as volunteer advocates. The SANE position is paid, including on/call pay.

In-person presentations to prevent sexual violence at universities will be starting as the school year begins.

The Child Advocacy Center remains busy providing services to sexually abused youth and their families.
