Suicide Rates on the Rise-from Contact USA

The National Center for Health Statistics recently released a major study, examining trends in rates of suicide. The suicide rate in the United States increased an alarming 24 percent from 1999 to 2014, the greatest percentage of increases occurring among girls aged 10-14 and men aged 45-64 years of age. The rate increased by 1% per year from 1999-2006, and then doubled to 2% after that. The increases follow a period of near constant decline in suicide rates from 1986 through 1999. In addition, the rates increased in every racial and gender category except for black men. It is estimated that 22 veterans take their lives each day. Overall, the national rate rose to 13 deaths per 100,000 people in 2014.

Suicide deaths continue to receive little attention. In the United States alone, over 750 individuals die by suicide each week. Visualize two jumbo jets crashing each week and you get the sense of the scope of this issue. If two jets were crashing every week, there would be massive attention and resources. Despite its serious impact on the general population, suicide remains an unspeakable problem.

Dial Help Safety Net Program: Supporting Individuals At Risk of Suicide

Dial Help's Safety Net Program Manager traveled to Washington D.C., to make a mandatory final presentation for the SAMHSA Suicide Follow Up Grant. James Wright, the grant director at SAMHSA, was particularly pleased with the percentage of clients Dial Help was able to help move into long-term treatment after an emergency department intervention. In addition to sharing with and learning from the other crisis centers involved in the project, the opportunity to learn about future possibilities in the suicide prevention field was invaluable. Because of the hard work by the entire Dial Help team, the grant has been extended for an additional year.
