Emergency Flood Response

Father's Day Weekend brought torrential rainfalls that created chaos and disaster in Houghton County. Flash floods damaged roads, homes, and businesses in Chassell, Houghton, Hancock, Lake Linden, and more. More than 60 sinkholes were reported throughout the county, and a 12-year-old boy tragically lost his life during the flooding.

Response in the community was immediate. Volunteers, supplies, and funds began pouring in from across the Upper Peninsula. The Keweenaw Community Foundation and Portage Health Foundation both established relief funds and organized other efforts.

Aware of the mental health toll disasters can have on people, PHF made funds available to Dial Help to act as a central, sustainable call center, working in conjunction with the volunteer resource center.

Our role includes 24/7 crisis support via phone, text, instant messaging, walk-ins, or outreach visits; linking flood victims to vital services and resources, including volunteers; system navigation and follow-up to ensure connection with professionals; family support services; and personalized emergency and/or temporary assistance.

In addition, the Keweenaw Community Foundation is partnering with Dial Help to coordinate the distribution of gift certificates to the most in need throughout the county.

Our agency is honored to be a part of these intensive collaborative efforts to support those impacted by the flood. The Houghton County community is truly #CopperCountryStrong



New Program This Quarter

With funding from the MI Department of Health and Human Services, Dial Help has launched a new program for juvenile justice youth in Baraga, Houghton, Keweenaw, and Ontonagon Counties. The Juvenile Justice Response Team (JRT) provides face-to-face crisis intervention to youth age 10 to 21 who have had a Petition filed under the Probate Code. The goal of this program is to interrupt the school-to-prison pipeline by providing safety and support to at-risk youth.

"We want to give youth in the juvenile justice system the support they need to get on a better path in this critical period prior to adulthood," said Rebecca Crane, Dial Help Executive Director. "So often, what is labeled as 'delinquent behavior' is really a manifestation of trauma, neglect, or crisis. We hope to address this with short-term and on-going services."

Dial Help worked closely with local law enforcement and court officials to develop a referral system for this program. Other community partners include Copper Country Mental Health, Communities That Care, and various school faculty including the truancy officer.
