Michigan public schools will be required to put a suicide prevention hotline number on student ID cards. <u>Click here for more info.</u>

The President signed into law a bipartisan bill to create a three-digit number for mental health emergencies. The Federal Communications Commission had already picked 988 as the number for this hotline and aims to have it up and running by July 2022.
