- Support the development of each YouthBuild site to be self-sufficient for their economic, social, community, education and training needs.



First Nations YouthBuild Program Outcomes

Program Outcomes:

Livelihoods:

- Youth placement into quality, sustainable livelihoods: (jobs, self-employment, return to formal education/technical training);
- Livelihood retention up to six months post-graduation;
- Acquisition of industry-recognized skills credentials.

Learning:

- Student rates of enrollment/retention/graduation;
- Secondary education credential completion rates; and skills credential attainment rates;
- Post-YouthBuild school/center graduation placement rates into jobs, continuing education, training;
- Completion of workplace-based internships.

Leadership:

- Numbers/types of CAB projects completed;
- Numbers of leadership service hours contributed by young people;
- Achievement levels of individual/group/community leadership competencies (portfolio).

Youth Mindset Outcomes:

- Increased knowledge and confidence to develop livelihood networks and mentors;
- Persistence in seeking productive and meaningful livelihood options. Positive self-concept; increased confidence and resiliency.
- Increase in academic/learning motivation;
- Increase in ability to link learning resources to livelihood outcomes;
- Increase in commitment to high school/PSE completion/lifelong learning.

National Intermediary Role: FNYB Canada, Inc.

Inspire Learning:

- Facilitate research on priority network questions.
- Scan, capture, synthesize and share out network innovations.
- Design peer sharing events to facilitate exchange among staff, students, graduates and network partners.

Grow depth and diversity of Network financial support

Mobilize diverse sources of finance to support network services; Charter member operations/growth plans; and underwrite innovations and research.

Document Impact:

- Host network monitoring and evaluation systems to collect data on individual program and collective network impact.
- Manage quality control systems and agreements across the network.
- Manage entry and exit of network members.
- Assemble impact reports for internal and external audiences.

Build and manage the virtual and in-person platforms for OY exchange and networking. First Nations YouthBuild Canada, Inc.

Secure and Diversify Partnerships:

Cultivate NGO, training, education, government and private sector partnerships that yield technical and financial investments in youth livelihood creation.



Growth and Impact Planning Services:

Lead network member and network collective planning focused on growth, strategy, sustainability, and impact.



Three-Year Growth and Impact Goals

To fulfill in part the Truth and Reconciliation Committee calls to action #66 and #92.ii, FNYBC will secure consistent federal funding to develop and establish a youth program as described in the recommendation.

In alignment with AFN resolution 18-86, FNYBC will establish and support a network of YouthBuild programs across First Nations in Canada.

FNYBC will establish and expand the number of sites across Canada.

FNYBC will develop a training and support system for the adaptation and growth of YouthBuild programs in Canada.


