Handling of The Cases

- Remove the instrumentation access cover pressing lightly the locking system between the case and the cover.
- To close the case, position the cover on the base and press on it.
- For sterilization, the disinfected, clean and dry instruments should be conditioned in the case, which should be packed in surgical grade crepe paper or in plastic bags suitable for autoclave.
- During the sterilization, the case should not lean on the autoclave walls.

Sanitation Instructions

- Disassemble the case
- 2. Submerge the part fully into enzymatic detergent (diluted according to the manufacturer).
- 3. Wash in ultrasonic washer for approximately 10 to 15 minutes.
- 4. Rise with plenty of distilled water until the solution wastes are fully removed The utilization of nylon brushes is recommended.
- 5. Dry with a clean and dry cloth or with compressed air.
- 6. Perform a visual inspection, watching if there are faults with the cleaning process. If any wastes are still left, the part should be submerged again in detergent- step 1- and if necessary, the cleaning should be made with the help of a nylon brush. Repeat the rinsing and drying sequence.
- 7. If applicable, place the product in a suitable case duly sanitized and dried.
- 8. Select the package according to the sterilization process. It is recommended to use a surgical grade paper self-sealing package with laminated film.

NOTE: Do not use descaling products and avoid drying parts still containing cleaning solution wastes because such procedures favor oxidation. The use of steel brushes is not recommended.

Sterilization Guidelines

- It is recommended to follow the steam autoclave sterilization method and also, the parameters and procedures established in the standard BS EN ISO 17665-1:2006 (Sterilization of health care products. Moist heat. Requirements for the development validation and routine control of a sterilization process for medical devices).
- Recommended parameters: 121°C, 30 min, at 1 atm. Alternatively you may proceed according to the autoclave manufacturer's instruction. Sterilization validity: 7 to 15 days, provided that the product is conditioned in a clean, dry environment away from sunlight.
