FROM THE PROVOST'S DESK

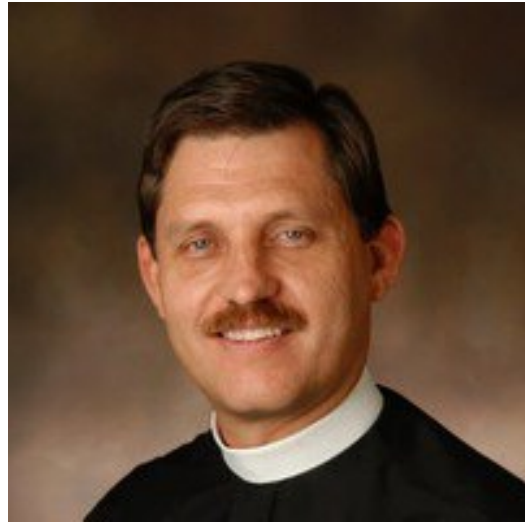

The partners present all signed concordats with this new Chapter. We were blessed by that. I would like to encourage each member of the clergy to make the effort to be in touch with your licensing bishop for him to know you and you to know him.

A retirement plan for the clergy is being set up with Glenview State bank. It will have the same parameters as the AMIA plan. I am hoping it will be ready to go by the end of next week. I will let everyone know

We have set up a plan for **background check** with a company called True Hire. This is for all clergy coming into AMI and for those looking to be ordained. The person needing a background check will go online with a log in code that I have. There is a \$130 fee payable upon registration. The results will be sent to the AMI office.



All clergy members will need evidence of a background check to be in good standing. If Dallas sends your employee file to us we will check to verify that you have one on file. If not then you will have to get a background check done.

We will keep you apprised of the developments in all these areas. Of course, if you need to reach me on any items see the information below.

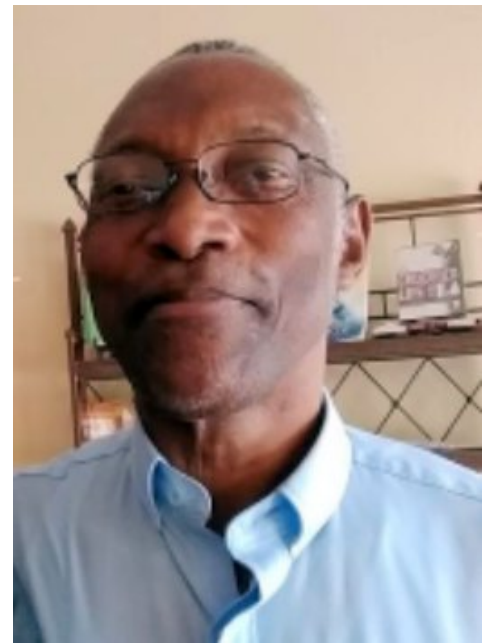
WEDDING ANNOUNCEMENT

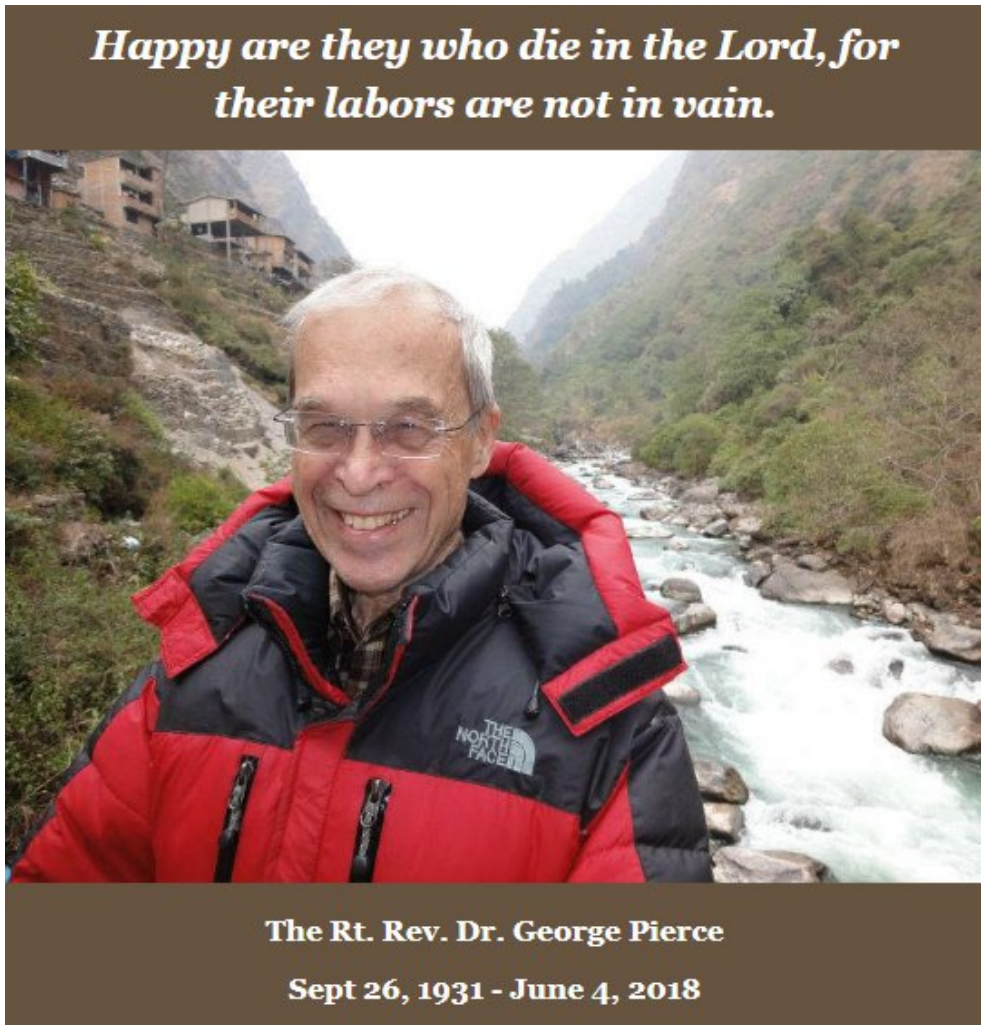
