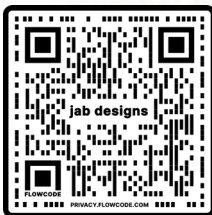

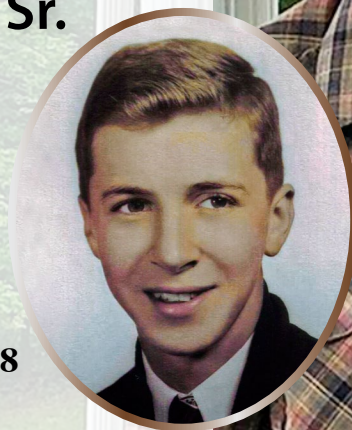

Henry Clarence Peraldo, Sr.

Henry Clarence Peraldo, Sr., 91 of Altamonte Springs, FL, passed peacefully into Heaven on June 28, 2024. He had a long and healthy life for over 90 years, and was eager to tell others that he had never spent a day in the hospital or had never taken medications. But he had been dealing with some health challenges in the past year.

Henry was born in Beckley, West Virginia on February 12, 1933 to Henri E. Peraldo of Piedacavallo, Italy and Bessie Greene of Beckley. He joined the National Guard in 1949 at age 16, and served until 1954. He graduated from Woodrow Wilson High School. He married Shirley Faye Webster of Glen White. They had four children, and while working, they attended Beckley College and raised a half acre garden every Spring. They lived in Beckley until 1962 when they moved to Central Florida.

Henry had many stories of the hardships he endured as a young person, but he felt that it helped mold him into the hard working, helpful, resilient person he became. He often spoke of the blessings he had been given by *“the Good Lord above.”*

Most of Henry’s jobs involved operating or driving large equipment. He plowed fields and gardens with his tractor for many neighbors in West Virginia, and then drove cement mixers and heavy equipment for a while. He worked on the construction of the West Virginia Turnpike, now part of Interstate 77, and then got a job hauling explosives for Dupont that took him through many states. In Florida he retired after 25 years of safe driving for Greyhound Bus Lines. He had several special memories of his years with Greyhound, most notably getting to drive a Greyhound bus around the Daytona Speedway and a charter he was assigned that transported the Lawrence Welk touring group.

Shirley and Henry became snowbirds in 1992, caring for their mothers for many years in Beckley and enjoying the milder summers and getting a taste of Spring and Fall there. They had two wonderful church families at First Baptist Church Sanlando Springs, now The Church of the Springs in Altamonte Springs, and Clifftop Missionary Baptist Church in Beaver, West Virginia. After Shirley passed in 2017, Henry continued to spend some time in West Virginia until this summer. As his health declined, and even though he missed Shirley every day, he kept a grateful attitude. Every day he would comment on what a beautiful life he had, how God had blessed him with a wonderful wife, family, and friends.

In addition to his **parents**, Henry was preceded in death by **granddaughter** Mandy Russell, **son** Arnold Peraldo, **wife** Shirley, **sister** Marti Hicks, and **brother** Homer Warden.

Left to cherish his memory are **daughter** – Debbie (Ron) Russell of Altamonte Springs, **son** – Henry Peraldo, Jr. of Apopka, and **daughter** – Anita (Tom) Tucker of Apopka; **grandson** – David (Sarah) Theophilus of Orlando, **granddaughter** – Jenni (John) Seegers of Elba, Alabama, **grandson** – Ryan Russell (Amy Tufaro) of Winter Garden, Angela (Jason) Ditmire of Maitland, FL, Jamie (Brandon) Williams of Apopka, and **grandson** – Michael (Lena) Peraldo of Longwood; **great grandchildren**, including – Taylor and Caden Seegers, Ava Theophilus, Ansley Ditmire, Amanda Russell, and Arabella and Easton Williams; **sister** – Sharon (John) Matherly; and also several **nieces** and **nephews** in Florida and West Virginia, **cousins** in Indiana and Virginia, other relatives, and many friends.
