Victor was born on March 17, 1938 to Agnes Nelson and Rainford Walters in Kingston, Jamaica.

He attended Cavaliers Primary School until age 14. Then he began working with his stepfather as an Apprentice Carpenter, and by age 21, he had become a Master Tradesman.

Victor set out to find more opportunity to utilize his carpentry; therefore, at 21, he migrated to the United States where he worked as a farmer. He returned to Jamaica the following year. He later migrated to Freeport, Grand Bahamas where he lived for several years, traveling back and forth to Jamaica. While in Freeport, he worked in the building field. Then in 1967, he became a legal resident of the United States as a skilled tradesman, working in Homestead, Florida. He received his certification in blueprint reading from Mid-Florida Tech in Orlando, Florida.

After Victor left Homestead, he moved to Deland, Florida to build condominiums. Upon the completion of that assignment, he commuted to Orlando, helping in the construction of many facilities, including Bruton's Funeral Home, and buildings at the Orlando Navy Base; this is where he met and married his wife, Clara, of 49 years.

Victor enjoyed working on construction projects in his home, as well as assisting many others with home and commercial renovations – churches, schools, and businesses. He was a gifted, master carpenter.

In his free time, he enjoyed cooking (he was an EXCELLENT cook!), and playing dominoes.

Victor was preceded in death by his **parents**, and his **brothers** – Selvyn McKay and his twin brother, Cleveland Walters.
