Denzel Irvin, affectionately known as Coach Zel, was born as a twin on November 7, 1995 to his proud parents, Pastor Djuan and Gwendolyn Irvin. He was the older twin by one hour and 5 minutes, and a big brother to his younger sister Tiffany as well.

Denzel grew up with a passion for football and a heart for leadership. A standout athlete, Denzel began his football journey at the age of 5 with the Pine Hills Trojans League. Years later, he attended and played at West Orange High School for two years before transferring to Foundation Academy for his junior and senior year. His skills on the field earned him recognition as an All-State and All-District selection as a Defensive Back, along with a 2x All-District selection as a Wide Receiver. Denzel's remarkable talent made history when he became the first Division 1 athlete to have attended Foundation Academy.

In 2014, Denzel committed to the University of North Carolina at Charlotte (UNCC), where he furthered his athletic career. In 2019, Denzel returned to UNCC as a Graduate Assistant (GA) under the Strength and Conditioning Staff, where he worked closely with players to enhance their performance. It was there that he met Josh Woods, the Strength and Conditioning Assistant Coach for the Miami Dolphins. Denzel also had the honor of assisting in UNCC's first-ever appearance at the Bahamas Bowl that same year.

However, Denzel's journey took an unexpected turn in March 2022 when he faced a life-threatening health crisis. After experiencing severe symptoms, he learned that his heart was only functioning at 10%. This began a challenging battle through 7 surgeries, 3 heart machines, and a stroke. In a miraculous turn of events, Denzel received a full heart transplant on April 25, 2022. Despite the gravity of his condition, he was discharged from the hospital just *six days* after his transplant surgery, a testament to his remarkable strength and determination. Denzel's faith in God, his resilience, and his unwavering spirit were the driving forces behind his recovery. As he often says, "*God changed and saved my life.*"

A beloved figure to his family and friends, Denzel was known for his infectious energy and leadership. Always striving to bring people together, Denzel loved his family deeply—especially his twin brother, with whom he shared a close, inseparable bond. He often spoke about staying connected with his family, including his mom and his close-knit circle of friends, whom he called his *"kids"* in reference to the athletes he mentored.


Denzel had a strong love for music that fueled his passion for life. He always had the latest beats playing in the background as he moved through life. As he often said: "What's up, Fam?! God is GOOD! It's a BLESSING just to be here. Get right!"

Coach Zel's personality was as vibrant as his football career. He's remembered by those who loved him as a leader, a motivator, and someone who would go out of his way to make others feel welcome. Denzel life journey is a powerful testament to the importance of always living with purpose.

Denzel was preceded in death by his **paternal grandparents** – Leonard and Mamie Irvin, and his **brother** – Djuan Xavier Irvin.

Denzel leaves to cherish memories of him: his **father** – Djuan Irvin, **mother** – Gwendolyn Irvin, **twin brother** – Darius (Kyla) Irvin, and **sister** – Tiffany Irvin; 2 **daughters** – Maya Faith Irvin (8 years old) and Kehlani Mae Irvin (6 months); **fiancée** – Ashanti Roberson; **bonus son** – Jeremiah Castro;

maternal grandmother – Genervie Green, and **maternal grandfather** – Daniel Wallace; **aunts** – Taneka Irvin and Laquisha Howard; **uncle** – LaQuan Howard; **nieces** – Emerie Pigott, Desirae Irvin, and Aniya Irvin; **great aunts**, **great uncles**, **cousins**, and a host of other relatives, and many, many friends.
