"MAY THE WORK I'VE DONE SPEAK FOR ME"

Loretta A. Jones was born on November 26, 1951, to Delores and George Adkins and was lovingly raised by Rosylin and Nathaniel Jones. As the oldest of four children, Loretta naturally took on the role of leader, nurturer, and protector. She was educated in the public schools of Orange County, Florida, attending Washington Shores Elementary, Carver Junior High, and The Great Jones High School, graduating in the class of 1969.

As a child, Loretta loved reading and math and was a wiz at playing jackstones. She was a proud member of the Jones High School band, where she played the saxophone and served as section leader. She later attended Florida A&M University (FAMU), where she majored in Business

From a young age, Loretta was raised in Shiloh Baptist Church of Orlando. Her service there was lifelong and faithful. She sang in the Youth Choir, the Sanctuary Choir, Choir Number Three, and the Gospel Choir. She was also active in the Culinary Ministry, served breakfast to the less fortunate on Wednesday mornings, managed the church's Clothes Closet, and held a seat on the Finance Committee. Loretta believed in serving God and her community with excellence.

Loretta was the proud mother of two daughters and as a single mother she worked hard and long to provide for them. She worked at Walt Disney World during its very first year of operation, and later, she began a long and accomplished career at the Greater Orlando Aviation Authority. where she served with distinction for 27 years in Accounting before retiring.

As a single mother, Loretta embodied resilience, wisdom, and a tireless work ethic. She took on seasonal and summer jobs, including work at Lionel Toy Play World, to ensure her girls had everything they needed for school and summer outings. She taught them the value of responsibility, integrity, and hard work. "You work for what you want," she would say, and "Learn to do without so you can keep your voice."

There were five years between her daughters, Vinetta and Ceyretta, but they were raised with the same grounding principles. Loretta passed down her mother's culinary gifts and was known as an exceptional cook in her own right. Her dishes were as memorable as her wisdom.

Deeply connected to her community, Loretta served several terms as Secretary for the Washington Shores Homeowners Association, where she assisted with grant writing. She was also a member of the AMVETS Ladies Auxiliary at the John P. Piner Post No. 30.

Loretta was known for her honesty, reliability, and being a "straight, no chaser" kind of woman. She didn't entertain drama and had no patience for foolishness. She often reminded her daughters to self-report, saying, "Tell me the truth before I hear it from someone else." Her favorite sayings were: "Where you act up, I act up," and "If you're grown enough to do it, be grown enough to own up to it." She believed in accountability, pride in one's name, and doing things the right way.

She loved bright colors, a good sale, and had a sharp eye for quality—always encouraging her girls to "Buy the best you can with what you have." In her downtime, Loretta enjoyed actionpacked sci-fi movies, shopping, sleeping, and traveling the world.

Loretta was an adventurer at heart. She was a proud member of the Golden Divas and traveled to breathtaking destinations including Japan, China, the Mediterranean, Greece, Italy, Holland, Madagascar, Valencia, Spain, and Cape Town, South Africa among many other destinations. She had already paid in full for a European cruise she was scheduled to take next month evidence that she lived with hope, purpose, and plans for the future.

Her favorite music included Earth, Wind & Fire and The Spinners. Her palate was just as specific—she loved hot cinnamon candy, sweet tea, Coca-Cola, and a good cut of rare steak. Every conversation with her ended with the warm, signature phrase: "All right, my dear. I'll


