

Bernadine Adele Blumhagen

"To the pure in heart, all things are pure"....that verse was personified in the person of Bernadine Adele Blumhagen as much as any person could be. Her kindness and her innocence, her *graciousness* must truly have been pleasing to God. Bernie joined the Church Triumphant when she passed away peacefully on Friday, January 13, surrounded by family at her daughter's home.

Bernadine was born in Grand Meadow Township in Iowa on July 20, 1932 to William and Amelia (Hamann) Kugel. She was baptized on August 14, 1932 and confirmed April 18, 1946 at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Postville. She grew up in the day of the one-room school house, and spent 9 years at the Bailey Country School. She then went on to attend public school in Postville and graduated from Postville High School in 1950.

She was united in marriage to Ronald C. Blumhagen on September 30, 1951. Ron and Bernie farmed just south of Monona, Iowa for many years. During this time, Bernie was very involved at their church, St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Monona. Besides serving on the Church Council, she also served as President of the local ALCW, and as President of the Decorah Conference ALCW. From 1977-80, she served as the Iowa District ALCW President and was a member on the District ALC Council and the National ALCW Board. Bernie also worked as an aide at the Monona Pre-School for eighteen years.

Bernie enjoyed traveling and a couple of those

highlights included a trip to the Holy Land in 1973 with a group from St. Paul's. Bernie and Ron also got to experience a trip to Japan involving an exchange program with a church there. They spent many weekends antiquing [though Bernie often took a book along to read....just in case!] Bernie loved supporting the Iowa Hawkeyes, but her fiercest loyalty was saved for her Chicago Cubs!

Ron and Bernie were only weeks away from a permanent move to Florida when Ron passed away unexpectedly in September of 1995.

Since the plan was already in place, Bernie chose to move down to Melbourne anyway, to be close to her family. She soon became a member of Advent Lutheran Church in Melbourne. Because of her love of singing, she quickly joined the choir, just as she had been a member of the choir in her home church in Iowa. Bernie volunteered in many different areas at Advent, including leading the Woman's Bible Study for many years.

Bernie was preceded in death by her **husband** – Ron; her parents – William and Amelia Kugel; her **brothers** – Donald & Vernon Kugel; and her **sister** – Eunice Torson.

Those surviving to cherish her memory include her son – Jon (Earline) Blumhagen, her daughters – Jyl (Dennis) Lee and Cressa (Don) Miller; her beloved grandchildren – Lindsay (Clint) Pearson, Carrie Lee, Torin Blumhagen, Kyrra and Garrett Miller, Reggie Holmes, Sabrina Doggett, Alaina Mitchell, and Melisha Battle; 1 sister – Gertrude (Keith) Lee; 3 sisters-in-law – Margaret Kugel, Wilma Kugel, Joanita (Dan) Schweikert; 1 brother-in-law – Ray (Dorothy) Suckow; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends.

Bernie was always smiling and always had a kind word for everyone. She was known as "The Card Lady" because she always remembered everyone's birthday! Bernie had a genuine love for the Lord and a generous spirit.

In 1994, she was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease. However, she never let it stop her and continued her morning walks until this past October. Because three out of five siblings in her family were diagnosed with the disease, an ongoing research study is taking place at the Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville. To this end, Bernie, as a final unselfish act, donated her brain and part of her brain stem to this research.
