Dr. David Nathaniel Robinson

Dr. David Nathaniel Robinson was born on July 12, 1962 in Hollywood, Florida. He was the seventh of eight children born to Bishop Leonard Robinson and the late Mrs. Merris Robinson. Beginning from very early childhood, his parents instilled in him the true meaning of Christian love by precepts and example.

Dr. Robinson was the beloved husband of Dr. Kimberly Robinson as well as the devoted father to Danielle, who is a Sophomore at Spelman College in Atlanta, and David Jr., who is a Junior at Trinity Preparatory School in Winter Park.

As a husband, he showered his wife with love, appreciation, and the support of a best friend for twenty-six wonderful years. As a father, he instilled the value of hard work. He would often say "The only place that 'success' comes before 'work' is in the dictionary!"

As a loving and supportive parent, he believed in his children, even when they didn't believe in themselves. He was a phenomenal coach to his children, and supported them in all their endeavors including: piano, tennis, basketball, track and field, homework and school projects. Even with the demands of a busy medical practice, he never missed a piano recital or major athletic event.

Dr. David Robinson was a soft spoken, kind hearted person who was a true servant of God. He led an exemplary life of praise and service to the Lord. He started each day in devotion to God and ended each day the same. He was a member of the Life Center Church and worked tirelessly to honor God at home, work, and wherever he tread. He was generous with his time and finances, but often shied away from recognition for all the service he provided.

He offered all that he could whenever he saw a need. If there was an opportunity to provide a smile, a word of wisdom or a pat on the back, he was there to fulfill the need. He was an incredibly humble man. The people who knew him best knew of his strong faith in God and could recognize his incredibly contagious laugh even in a crowded room.

David grew up in the Church of God of Prophecy where his father, Bishop Leonard Robinson has pastored since 1973. There, David sang in the choir and played the trumpet. He graduated from McArthur High School where he was on the wrestling team and was an honor roll student. Following graduation, he matriculated to the University of Florida where he continued to excel. **Dr. Robinson** received his Bachelors of Science Degree in Microbiology in 1985 and his Doctor of Medicine degree in 1989 from the University of Florida. He was selected to complete the Internal Medicine Residency as well as the Hematology and Oncology Fellowship at Virginia Commonwealth University/ Medical College of Virginia in Richmond. While in Richmond, he was heavily involved in community outreach, focused on providing cancer treatment to indigent patients as well as compassionate hematology services, especially to those suffering from sickle cell disease.

Following this Fellowship, he relocated to Orlando in 1995. Dr. Robinson was Board Certified in Internal Medicine and Oncology and enthusiastically shared his expertise to help his patients and to enlighten those in our community. Dr. David Robinson worked with Premier Hematology & Oncology and served as Medical Director for the Osceola Division of the Florida Hospital Cancer Institute.

He was a member of the Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity, Beta Xi Boulé, and has served on the Board of Trustees for the Florida Hospital Foundation, Leukemia Society of America, and Kids Beating Cancer. The scarce leisure time he had was always well invested in times of enjoyment with his family, golfing, or helping the community.

In 2007 he received the Balance Award from his peers at Florida Hospital as a tribute to his successful integration of his faith, family and profession. Additionally, in 2009 he was awarded the Rosa Parks Outstanding Community Service Award from the African American Men's Health Summit for 10 years of continuous service to the organization's mission of increasing cancer awareness among men. In 2012 and 2013, Dr. Robinson was featured in the Orlando Magazine as one of the "Top Docs." David N. Robinson, M.D., was faithful, compassionate and humble . . . a man after God's own heart, who leaves many wonderful memories of a life well-lived.

He was preceded in death by his Mother, Merris Robinson, and his Brother, Paul Robinson.
