

# A Legacy<sup>™</sup>

### A Heritage: Character Qualities, Memoirs...

"To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven:

James W. Stapleton was born on August 2nd, 1926 to the late Reuben and Edith Stapleton in Brooklyn, New York. James was one of two sons born to this union, but his brother Milton preceded him in death in 1997. After graduating high school, James enlisted in the US Army. After serving two years he exited the Army with a honorable discharge, and went on to later join the New York City Housing Department in 1958. While working James attended John Jay College, where he obtained an Associate Degree in Communications and Electronics. He also studied and received a Federal First Class radio/telephone license, but he didn't stop there. His love for learning caused him to go on to major in Political Science and Public Administration and receive a Bachelor's Degree and a Master's Degree respectively.

His communication license afforded him clearance to be selected by the Police Department to go to Detroit to meet with a designer at Motorola and develop the walkie/talkie radio that is used by the police today. He then went on to take the necessary tests to become Sergeant, and then Lieutenant. He was later appointed Captain and transferred to the Internal Affairs Division. He was appointed Deputy Inspector, Full Inspector, and eventually he was appointed Deputy Chief.

During his Law Enforcement Career, James was also involved in various organizations. He served as the National Vice President for Eastern Region 1 of Noble, and President of the New York Chapter. He also held the position of Chairman of the Political Action Committee of the One Hundred Black Men Organization. In August of 1989, James retired from the New York City Police Department, but 9 months later he came out of retirement and was appointed Director of Administration for Battery Park City Authority by former Governor, Mario Cuomo. His appointment as the head of the Civilian Complaint Division was an historical achievement as he was the *first* Black man appointed, and was the *first* Black man appointed by a Black man. In 1992 James received an award for The Who's Who Worldwide for demonstrating Leadership Achievement in his profession.

By 1995, James had successfully completed this leg of his race, thus, he retired a second time and relocated to Orlando, Florida with his loving wife, Fredonia. In Orlando he enjoyed golfing, tinkering with electronics, building projects, and playing on the computer. He was a history buff and seemingly knew something about *everything*. Needless to say, James believed in hard work and wise living, and could often be heard giving this advice "live within

your means and work your way towards what you want."

James W. Stapleton was preceded in death by his **wife** – Fredonia, in 2002; **parents** – Reuben and Edith Stapleton, who were immigrants from St. Vincent [his **mother** was very close to having lived 100 years, passing at the ripe age of 99]; **brother** – Milton Stapleton; and **children** – James Stapleton Jr., Nadine Stapleton, & Debra Toppin.

To cherish many fond memories of a life well-lived, he leaves behind: **children** – Victoria (Gary) Pouncy of VA, Vanessa (Craig) Wilkins from New York, Annette (John) Bernard from Georgia, Marissa (Bruce) Stapleton from Florida, Shawana Stapleton, of New York, and Shannon (Tamika) Stapleton from New York; a host of **grandchildren**, **great grand children**, and **great-great grandchildren**;

two sisters-in-law – Elisse Elliott and Sarah Stapleton; one brother-in-law – Jerome Drayton; two nieces – Marie Oliver from Georgia, and Charisse Elliott of Florida; one nephew – Blaine Drayton from Maryland; other relatives and many friends.
