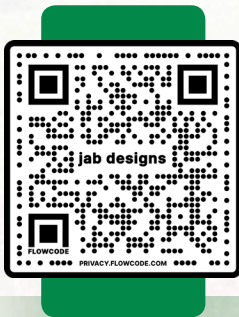

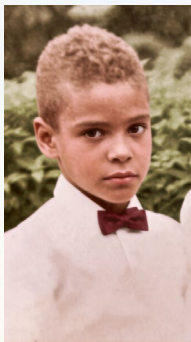

PETER MELVIN MCINTOSH M.D.

Peter Melvin McIntosh was born at Jubilee Hospital in Kingston, Jamaica, on October 1, 1958. He was the last of six siblings. He was baptized at St. Michael’s Episcopal Church in Kingston and spent his early years in Kingston and Linstead, St. Catherine. He attended Calabar Primary School and Rousseau’s Primary School.



Later, he attended Wolmer’s High School from 1971 to 1977. While at Wolmer’s, Peter represented the school in Track and Field at the National Boys Championship, running the 400-meter relay and the 800-meter event. He also represented the school in the Sunlight Cup Cricket Competition and participated in the Manning Cup and Walker Cup Soccer Competitions from 1974 through 1977. Peter was affectionately known as “Mackie.”

Peter was a Prefect in Lower Sixth Form in 1976 and later became Deputy Head Boy in Upper Sixth Form in 1977. He received numerous accolades from the school, including the Sidney McDonald Medal on two occasions for courage, loyalty, and devotion to duty while in Lower and Upper Sixth Form.



Peter was a member of the Cadet Corps and the Jamaica Defence Force (JDF) Flying Club in 1977. Upon graduation, through this activity, Peter attended Air Traffic Control School in Kingston. He worked at the Norman Manley International Airport Control Tower for one year. During this time, he continued to play soccer for local teams in Jamaica, earning a soccer scholarship to Marquette University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where he attended from 1979 through 1983.

During his junior and senior years, Peter was captain of the soccer team and was named Most Valuable Player (MVP). He also played for the Croatian Soccer Team while living in Milwaukee.

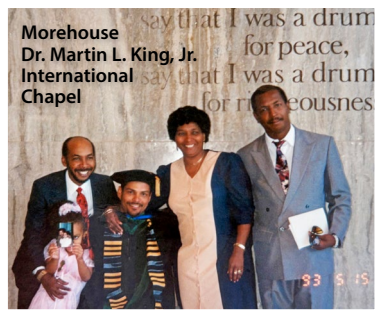
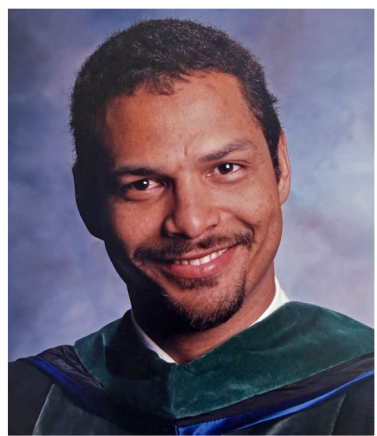
After graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology and Chemistry, Peter moved to Atlanta, Georgia. While there, he worked at Emory University in the Department of Psychiatry as a Research Assistant. He later worked with the State of Georgia at Morehouse School of Medicine, where he was involved in atherosclerosis research.



During that time, Peter married Tanya Williams, and they were blessed with a beautiful daughter, Tatiana Renee McIntosh, whom he loved very much. Tatiana passed away in a motor vehicle accident on March 18, 2007, while she was a sophomore at the University of Florida in Gainesville.

Peter started at Morehouse School of Medicine in 1988.

During the second semester of his first year of medical school, on March 5, 1989, Peter was involved in a motor vehicle accident that left him a paraplegic with a complete T4 spinal cord injury. After spending six months in the hospital



and rehabilitation, he returned to medical school despite the many challenges and setbacks. He graduated in the summer of 1993.

Peter completed a one-year internship at Memorial Medical Center in Savannah, Georgia, in 1994. He later completed a three-year residency program in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (PM&R) at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, in 1997. During his residency, he rotated through Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota; Scottsdale, Arizona; and Jacksonville, Florida. During this time, he completed a subspecialization in Spinal Cord Injury Medicine.

Upon completion of his residency, Peter accepted a Consultant Staff position with the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville, Florida, in 1997.

Peter officially retired (Emeritus status) after twenty-six years with the Mayo Clinic College of Medicine and Science in Jacksonville, Florida, in October 2023, with the academic rank of Assistant Professor of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation. Peter held numerous professional memberships in medical societies throughout his career. He also authored peer-reviewed journal articles, and book chapters between 2008 and 2015. In addition, he mentored spinal cord injury patients, especially in Jamaica, often on his own time, and provided medical supplies whenever he could.

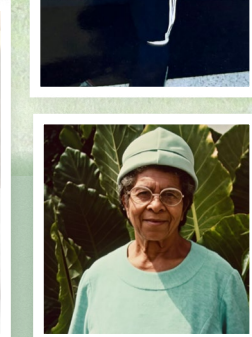
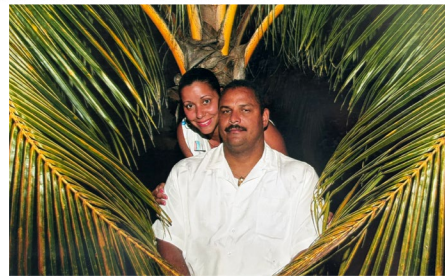
In July 2002, Peter married his beautiful bride, Denise Sloley, and embraced her daughter, Rachael, as his own beautiful daughter, whom he loved very much. Rachael is married to Jorge, who is a wonderful son-in-law, and together they blessed Peter with the most beautiful and precious granddaughter, Zara.

Peter was diagnosed with ALS in September 2022. Nevertheless, he did not complain. He trusted God. He faced the reality of the disease. He was very humble, while continuing to offer kindness, love, and the beautiful smile that everyone knew and loved.

Peter enjoyed traveling and cruising with his family and friends. He attended the 2012 Olympics in London and the 2018 World Cup in Russia, which were on his bucket list. In August 2024, Peter took his final trip to his beloved Jamaica. Peter *loved* sports (Arsenal), dominoes, reading, music, and nature, butterflies in particular.

Peter was preceded in death by his **parents**; his beloved **daughter**, Tatiana Renee McIntosh; and two **siblings**, Lena Romney and Keith White.

Cherishing the memories of a life well-lived are his **loving wife** – Denise Sloley-McIntosh; his **daughter** – Rachael; his **son-in-law** – Jorge; his **precious granddaughter** – Zara; three **siblings** – Errol (Jeanette) Roberts, Danny Roberts, and Durl Drummond; **brothers-in-law** – Ashton Romney and Maurice (Patricia) Sloley, M.D.; **sister-in-law** – Gail (Kevin) Charles; **nieces** – Donna, Carol (Roy), Nicola (Andrew), Sasha, Kelly, and Stephanie; **nephews** – Orlando (Laura) Heron, Maurice Jr., Matthew, Kristopher, Tyler, and Akeem; and a host of **cousins**, other **extended family members**, **colleagues**, and **dear friends**.
