Frustrated!!!

"It is more blessed to give than to receive."
—Acts 20:35b

I usually write any Emmaus newsletter article two weeks before the end of the month. Brenda Donnelly does such an outstanding job with our Greater Dayton Emmaus newsletter that I want to be sure to submit my article as soon as possible so that she doesn't have to wait for me.

But the notification from my To-Do list to write this article was honestly not a happy little reminder.

You see, today, I'm just about whipped, and it's only 10 AM! Myra and I are so tired that sometimes, it's all we can do to encourage one another to keep going.

We still own a home in Fairfield, Ohio that we bought just before the bubble burst in 2007. It has been underwater ever since. We were able to find renters to live in it for the past 6½ years when we moved to Germantown.

Now that the real estate market is hot in the area, and we have a chance to at least break even, we decided to have the renters move out and sell it. Unfortunately, the house was trashed when we got inside. So for the past 32 days, we have been hauling out trash, replacing toilets and faucets (yes, they took the ones they put in), scrubbing walls stained with the smoke of cigarettes and some other illegal smokes, replacing filthy carpet and painting from top to bottom. We replaced 25 dead light bulbs and repaired 15 out of 20 screen windows. Every time we go and fix some things, we add 4 or 5 more things to do. This week, I will spend one day in the office and three days at the house in the hopes of finishing everything to get it on the market. We are not rehabbers and are ready for this to be finished.

Plus today, I need to work on eleven talks that I will be giving next week at church camp. I will be the Pastor of the Week at Camp Wesley in Bellefontaine. This is my third year to do this because I believe so much in Christian Camping. But eleven talks are a lot to get ready.

Then I was asked to give the Justifying Grace talk at the July Women's Walk, and I need to preview it this week!

Right now, I affirm the sentiment one of my parishioners had once when she said, "I know God never gives me more than I can handle, but I sometimes wonder if He has mistaken me for someone else!"

Often when we find ourselves taxed to the breaking point, we can get frustrated. Why did this have to happen? Why can't I fix it? Why did I let myself get into this mess?

Too many things on one's plate can lead to frustration, but the Holy Spirit whispers into my ear asking, "On whose strength are you relying?" And I know that if I utilize my own strength, I will fail, falter and get frustrated.

Isaiah wrote, "Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint."

Are you frustrated with circumstances in life, whether it be a person, a situation, or maybe a potential?

In whose strength are you resting?

Bring me in, Dear Lord, help me grow!

“You’re my cave to hide in, my cliff to climb. Be my safe leader, be my true mountain guide. Free me from hidden traps; I want to hide in you. I’ve put my life in your hands. You won’t drop me, you’ll never let me down.” —Ps. 31:3-5

Let us feel safe in the cave of the Lord, to rest and rejuvenate. So much of our lives are spent acquiring, moving, sharing and digging into our daily work. With so much expenditure externally, it seems life hardly offers time necessary process what’s happening to us. We’re on to the next thing before we snap a finger.

Our Emmaus community, share groups, church groups and activities act as our sacred cave where we meet with grace and love; a worthy retreat from the bustle of life. We convene in praise of our good Father and receive vital nourishment. We must be aware of what we, directly or indirectly, deposit in the cave.

Stalactites and stalagmites are the icicle-like structures that hang in caves. The stalactites drip water to the matching stalagmites below, forming calcium deposits. Their growth is painstakingly slow at the rate of 13mm a year. After thousands of years, the two structures finally meet as one. Thankfully, our spiritual growth is usually a bit quicker to evolve, especially when nurtured by a great church family and our Emmaus community.

The interesting thing about the stalactites and stalagmites is that they continue to grow in the cave for thousands of years until they are complete; but touched by human hands just once retards their growth forever. Sealed by the oils of human touch, the structures remain suspended without further growth. This is reflective of how we can easily affect our communities either positively or negatively with our thoughts, actions and deeds. We honor each other’s individuality with a respectful and protective quality when we use right action, right speech and good judgement. May we be fully unified in Christ as we invite new pilgrims and new members under His wing.

“What a stack of blessings you have piled up for those who worship you, Ready and waiting for all who run to You to escape an unkind world. You hide them safely away from the opposition as you slam the door on those oily, mocking faces. Blessed God!” —Ps. 31:19

Let us take refuge in our Emmaus community as we share His message with the world; inviting new pilgrims and members knowing each person is recognizing and receiving God in their unique way.
