From 1986-1992, he served as Director of Spiritual Formation for The Upper Room and as the International Spiritual Director of The Walk to Emmaus and Chrysalis. Steve is an author and launched Discipleship Resources International, a resourcing initiative for Central Conferences.

Pat Luna is an international consultant/instructor in stewardship, board member of the General Board of Church and Society and a recipient of the Denman Award for Evangelism. She has been a retreat leader for the Academy for Spiritual Formation and is deeply involved with the Emmaus ministry since her Walk in 1985.

Jacob and Rachel Armstrong founded Providence Church near Nashville TN in 2008 to see those who are disconnected from God and the church find hope, healing and wholeness in Jesus Christ. They co-authored the book The Connected Life: Small Groups that Build Community. Jacob attended Chrysalis is 1998 where he felt called to the ministry. Rachel attended the Walk to Emmaus in 2002.

You can now signup for the Greater Dayton Emmaus Community trip to the Holy Land October 28—November 7, 2019. We will see the places of Scripture, deepen your understanding of the Bible, and walk in the footsteps of Jesus, plus share Communion at Emmaus. There will be optional extensions afterwards, either retracing the Exodus to Mt. Sinai, Cairo, and the pyramids, or go to Jordan, Mt. Nebo, and Petra. The trip will be organized through Educational Opportunities, a travel company that has specialized in Christian trips since 1974.
