Chairman's Corner

"Do you love me? Feed my sheep." John 21:17

My name is Barbara Courtice and I attended the Greater Dayton Women's Walk to Emmaus #61 and sat at the table of Elizabeth (CLAP!). I am your new Community Lay Director from April 2018 through March 2019, and I am truly humbled to serve God and his community in this way.

On February 21, 2018, the world said goodbye to the Rev. Billy Graham. I saw in a video that his daily devotional habit included reading 3-5 Psalms, one Proverb, and a reading from Acts of the Apostles. He also read one Gospel a month. I tried this during this season of Lent and found that this process launched me into quite a bit of quiet reflection, vivid imagery and some conviction about attention span! This reminded me of the Grow through Study Talk, particularly the "Grow" part; the richness of the Psalms and Proverbs urged and challenged an attitude of Piety; and Acts and the Gospel (of John) demonstrates the power of the Word, through the Holy Spirit in providing the canvas upon which to listen, to prepare, to serve, to become available; to obey Jesus' command to feed, to follow, to love.

Thirteen years ago, I completed my pilgrim experience on the Greater Dayton Women's Walk. I don't remember any specific Talks, but what I do vividly remember is one dear servant of God, pushing and pulling a mop because the bathroom floor had gotten very wet during a pilgrim break. She was smiling; there may have been a halo, (I don't remember) but there was a love message, an offering of service, a selfless giving without counting the cost, a "getting on with it" with joy. Action — the third leg of the stool in a Life in Grace.

The cool thing about the ministry of Emmaus is that in whatever we are challenged to do or become in our life, the mental image of a Life in Grace held up by Piety, Study, Action goes with us in our Fourth Day. It's an ideal and a challenge. The Service Card encourages us in our Share Group, so that when Jesus asks us, "Do you love me?" We can give testimony of HIS love, HIS voice, HIS work in our life!

Thanks to God and the GDE Community for allowing me to serve Jesus in 2018 — 2019, and through His instrument. It's going to be a great year because God Reigns!


Opportunity to Move Old Foam Mats

Kintsugi

The Japanese, known for their beauty in many practices, created an artform called Kintsugi, the art of repairing broken pottery with lacquer mixed with gold. Our good and gracious Father mends our wounds with the gold of His wisdom each time we turn to Him.

We have all experienced the pain and let down of breakages in our life. Hearts break, relationships endure breakages, emotional, spiritual, physical ... I mean, the list goes on and all breakages come accompanied by an indescribable amount of pain ... and eventually healing.

"The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." Ps. 34:18

We are met by God in our darkest times where He gives us comfort, hope and a promise of healing. In the spirit of Kintsugi, that which was once considered a "loss" is not only returned to a state of wholeness but said to have an increased value after its repair. We were made new by Jesus' suffering and offered renewal through His grace and endless mercies. It's as if He offers us a continual "UPGRADE" status through our pain.
