Can you feel it? Spring is just around the corner. It's time for warmer weather, longer days and daylight savings — or as some refer to it, a time to change your clock, spring forward or lose an hour of sleep. For Christians, we know the One who never changes.

#### **Name Tag Guidelines**




Please wear your Emmaus name tag to all Emmaus community activities including; walk weekends, Gatherings, all serving activities prior to, during or after walks.

#### For Whom Do You Weep?

One day during our Holy Land trip in November, Myra and I and our group found ourselves on the Mount of Olives, looking down towards the beautiful city of Jerusalem. Of course, the Dome of the Rock dominated our view, but we could also see the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, the Eastern Wall and Kidron Valley, along with other churches and holy places. I could imagine the place where the Temple once stood and the gate through which Jesus entered the city on Palm Sunday.

And I couldn't help but remember Christ's words as He was entering the city on that day:

But as they came closer to Jerusalem and Jesus saw the city ahead, he began to weep. "How I wish today that you of all people would understand the way to peace. But now it is too late, and peace is hidden from your eyes. Before long your enemies will build ramparts against your walls and encircle you and close in on you from every side. They will crush you into the ground, and your children with you. Your enemies will not leave a single stone in place, because you did not accept your opportunity for salvation."

-Luke 19:41-44, NLT

Jesus wept over the people and city that He loved, who would in a few short days clamor for His crucifixion. He knew they were missing an opportunity for salvation.

For whom do you weep? Who do you know is missing their opportunity for salvation right now? Which of your friends, relatives, acquaintances and neighbors do not know the love of Christ in their lives, whose eternal destiny leads to a track away from God? Whose eternal soul causes you to weep?

You need to start praying for them, asking the Lord to soften their heart. You need to discern opportunities to engage them in conversation about your faith. Your life needs to be complimentary of a redeemed nature. You need to be ready at a moment's notice to share the reason for your faith. You need to have courage and know that the Holy Spirit will lead.

They are not ready for an Emmaus Walk. Remember, the purpose of Emmaus is to strengthen leaders within the church. But someday, if their lives have accepted the opportunity for salvation, they may be ready to go on a Walk. But they must be reached first before they can travel.
