Message from the Spiritual Director: **Love Conquers Hate**

“Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.”

— Romans 8:35,37



I have always been inspired by the story behind the book “The Hiding Place” by Corrie Ten Boom. It is a true-life account of a Dutch Christian family who provided a safe house for Jews during World War II, and their eventual capture and imprisonment. Corrie and her sister, Bessie, found themselves in several prisons and concentration camps, living in conditions that were deplorable and inhumane.

In one place, they realized that their beds were full of lice. Bessie praised God for all things and thanked Him even for the lice. Later they realized that they were free to have Bible Studies and share the love of Christ without fear of discovery because of the lice; the guards would not come in. God could even use lice to further His kingdom.

As I read the book, I wondered how many women experienced God’s love in those places of hate because of Corrie and Bessie. Most of the women who were imprisoned with them had every right to hate and despise the Nazis, and even God. But Corrie and Bessie taught them that God’s love was more powerful than labor camps, disease, suffering and extermination.

Fortunately, as the pilgrims come for this month’s Women’s Walk, their accommodations will be absent of lice and the other hardships, but it will not be missing God’s love, demonstrated first through the Team and then through the Community. I can tell you as we observed the pilgrims on the Men’s Walk marvel at the commitment of love displayed by those that braved the winter storm to come to Candlelight and provide meals that their hearts became overwhelmed. Any obstacles to experiencing the Lord in their midst were broken down by the Agape love they witnessed. “Know, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us.”

Jesus went through it all, and still loved those who were persecuting Him. His love conquers all things, even those troubles and disappointments you face. Remember that, as you go through the trials of life, that you can be a witness to others because you are a conqueror!

Team Formation:

The ins and outs of building a Walk to Emmaus team



Do you remember all those smiling faces who greeted you Thursday night as you filed into the conference room to begin your Walk to Emmaus? All of you gathered together for a grand pilgrimage — the Emmaus Road Experience.

You didn't know who was new, like you, or who was there to lead the discussions and give the talks until introductions were made. The prayer servants (PS), assistant lay directors (ALD), logistic people (LOGS), spiritual directors (SD) and Lay Director (LD) were identified the first night yet it wasn't until Friday morning when you learned who would become YOUR leaders and table mates.

The Holy Spirit determines who serves and who belongs together at the table for each walk. The process of team formation begins six months before every walk weekend. The LD is selected by the Board of Directors then the team selection committee (TSC) committee begins their job. The TSC meets eight times per year. This committee is made up of the Vice Chair of the Emmaus board, a community Spiritual director,

two men and two women from our community. Past Lay directors or highly experienced team members serve on the TSC for a term of two years.

The purpose of the TSC is to pray for the LD of each walk, assemble call lists from which team members are selected, and encourage and assist people to fill out an online willing servant form at Gatherings.

To be honest, the lists for some positions are short. We need more willing servants to serve on team. We need individuals who are spending time in prayer and asking God if they are being called to serve on a team. God equips those He calls.

Great things occur on Emmaus weekends. Burdens are lifted, restoration occurs, guilt and shame is left behind. A closer walk with Jesus often results and people grow through study after completion.

Christ is counting on you. The LDs and team lists have been made up as you read this article because our summer walks begin in 6 months. Please spend time in prayer with Our Father regarding your role at Emmaus. Serving in the kitchen, helping with housing, praying at your prayer vigil time are all vital experiences on the weekend, however, more people are needed to serve on a team.

Thank you for your service thus far and continue to be His hands and feet in some capacity at future walks.


