#### Notes from the Spiritual Director

Waiting on God Ever heard the phrase (or maybe you've used it), "I'm waiting on the Lord"? Sounds spiritual, doesn't it? Today I want to challenge the placeholder that phrase has become.

I have a friend of mine who says they're going to ask the Lord what took Him so long in answering some things. I always contend that they will have more pressing questions than those of the time it took to accomplish something. Here is the point I want to bring out...in asking the Lord what took so long what would you do if He posed the same question to you?

He has given us His authority, His name and His Word to navigate our time here on earth. There is so much that could be done with what we have been given, the problem becomes our not recognizing what is given to us as a responsibility as opposed to what only the Lord, Himself, can do. I have a phrase that I use that goes, "It is easier to place blame than it is to take responsibility".

Look at what the Psalmist tells us in Psalm 115 verses15 and 16 Ye are blessed of the LORD which made heaven and earth. 16 The heaven, even the heavens, are the LORD'S: but the earth hath he Lord and He has given us the earth. There are those who would have you think that verse applies to the millennial reign of Jesus. And while there may be a future application to this, there is also a very present one as well.

The fundamental problem we face as Christians is one of two extremes - either we do it all and God plays no part or God does it all and we play no part. Both extremes are in error. Scripture reminds us that we are called to partnership with the Lord (1 John 1:3) and in a partnership there are responsibilities. God won't do our part and we can't do His part - so it is best that we stay in our respective lanes and accomplish what we are assigned to do. What does any of this have to do with waiting on God? Everything.

What I want us to do is awaken to the idea that while we may find ourselves "waiting" that we not disqualify ourselves from a blessing of obedience because we haven't done our part. In other words I don't want to be found "waiting on God" when in fact He is waiting on me. Think about this...our definition of waiting is idly occupying time until something (we are expecting) happens. The bible definition of waiting (and it is a lot longer) is to initiate the process of applying faith to a promise or a direction given to us by the Lord and to continue applying whatever is needed to that process while we await the manifestation of the answer we desire from the Lord. (Told you it was a longer definition). In closing, I want to remind you of a promise found in Galatians chapter 6 and verse 9 which says, "And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint given to the children of men. We are blessed of the not." Trusting in God is well doing. Standing in faith is well doing. Holding on to the promises of God for our situation is well doing. Praying is well doing. Reading and studying the Word is well doing. Having faith in God is well doing. And the enemy of your soul, satan, will do everything he can to discourage you in every one of those areas. But don't listen to him because he is a liar and the father of lies (according to John chapter 8). We have already been promised by God that we will reap in due season if we don't give up.


