# Message from the Spiritual Director

*“Blessed are the eyes that see what you see. For I tell you that many prophets and kings wanted to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.”*

Luke 10:23b-24

Many people have much to say about love. Whether it's romantic, platonic, practical, familial, or obsessive love, love—as a concept—has existed throughout human history. Yet, while sincere love, selfless love, divine love, or more specifically, agape love, may exist, they are not present among everyone.

In recent months, there has been division, strife, hate, and vitriolic language that is hurtful and repulsive. The 2024 election has revealed the true nature of many, and it is incredibly disappointing.

Social media has become a barrier to meaningful conversation and the sharing of opinions and differences without fostering division or hate.

More specifically, children of God have a responsibility to one another, not just to fellow Christians but to everyone.

Jesus, our ultimate example of agape love, would be deeply saddened to see that those who follow Him have strayed from His teachings. Where is the love?

Jesus was not concerned with ethnicity, national origin, politics, or socioeconomic status. His primary focus was on the welfare of others, salvation, and seeking to save the lost. How have we wandered so far from this?

Emmaus aims to inspire and equip local church members to take Christian action. The Emmaus movement seeks to unite people; it embodies spiritual renewal to strengthen the church, rediscover Christ, build friendships, oppose injustice, and demonstrate solidarity with those in need. That is the church, at least the church that I believe Christ calls us to be.

So, the next time you hear, “love, love, love, love,” remember that the essence of the gospel can be captured in that one word: love.



## A WORD FROM THE COMMUNITY CHAIR

### Happy February Community!

First of all, I would like to welcome our new pilgrims from Men's Walk #72 to our Community.

We look forward to seeing you at Gatherings and invite you to join us as we serve Women's Walk #113 in a few short weeks.

The first three months of the year are usually busy for Greater Dayton Emmaus with Walks in January and February.

Please keep the women's walk in your prayers and attend as many of the community events as possible.

Soon, we will be revamping Sponsorship by asking you to attend a Sponsorship training...even if you have already sponsored many pilgrims, refreshers and updates are always good.

Did you know that we have a booklet for sponsors to read prior to sponsoring a pilgrim? We do, and you will get one when you come to the training.

We are going to ask you to sign in so we can keep track of folks who have done the training and check this list when we get our pilgrim applications.

You may be very surprised at what you will learn after reading your book.

In addition to Sponsor Training, we will also be adding a Sponsor's Minute to each Gathering agenda. The Registrars will be providing tips to help Sponsors enhance their experience with their pilgrim.

Lastly, I want to talk about attendance at our Gatherings. What we are noticing is that we average about 20 pilgrims a weekend, multiplying that by four weekends and we have about 80 folks participating in a Walk to Emmaus each year.

However, our Gatherings are only averaging about 40 people. We have a lot more people in the month after a walk and then suddenly, we are back down to average of 40 people.

How can we get our Gatherings to grow back to a full house? What would bring you back month after month...I want to know.

This is a time to reconnect with your table, the community, get recharged by hearing a 4th Day Speaker, worship together, share Holy Communion and so much more.

I think that some churches like to use the Weekend as an end to a program that their people have done at their church. The Walk to Emmaus is more than that and is meant to grow leaders in your church.

Please consider making the 2nd Monday of every month, a rock on your calendar that contributes to your Spiritual growth.

Since this is a month that people like to think about love, consider Jesus as the one love that will never forsake you or leave you. He writes the best love letters to us.

Remember the greatest commandment, love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind and soul and strength and love your neighbor as yourself.


