

REMEMBER?

One of the greatest gifts given to men by God is the power of remembrance. One of the greatest gifts turned against us by the enemy of our souls is remembrance.

True, not all of us had stellar upbringings or the perfect this or that – but if we have made Jesus the Lord of our life, then we have a fresh start.

Where are you going with this, Bishop? Suffice it to say I want you to know that God intends for us to use remembrance as a rear-view mirror for us to glance behind so we are aware of how far we have come.

Do you remember your walk? Remember the first night when you were left alone with your thoughts and you were trying to figure out what you had gotten yourself into? Do you remember a couple of days later as you prepared to start your first Fourth Day and how you wanted to stay within the confines of the previous days?

You've had a lot of Fourth Days since then. I want you to stop and think about the Fourth Day you find yourself in right now. Life may have thrown some curves at you, but one thing is constant – the love of God is still there. The presence of God is still available. He is still walking with you in this Fourth Day.

Remembering can be a powerful force in our lives, because it can make us present in a moment with God where we need to (and can) connect with Him. Sometimes we tend to remember only the struggle or the hard times we are facing.

Can I let you in on something? If you think about it there have been times when there seemed to be no way out, like you were not going to make it and guess what?



God got you through it and you are still here. Maybe a little bruised but wiser and stronger than before.

When David faced Goliath, he recounted how God had delivered him from a bear and a lion (1 Samuel 17) – fights that could've ended without our ever knowing the story of David.

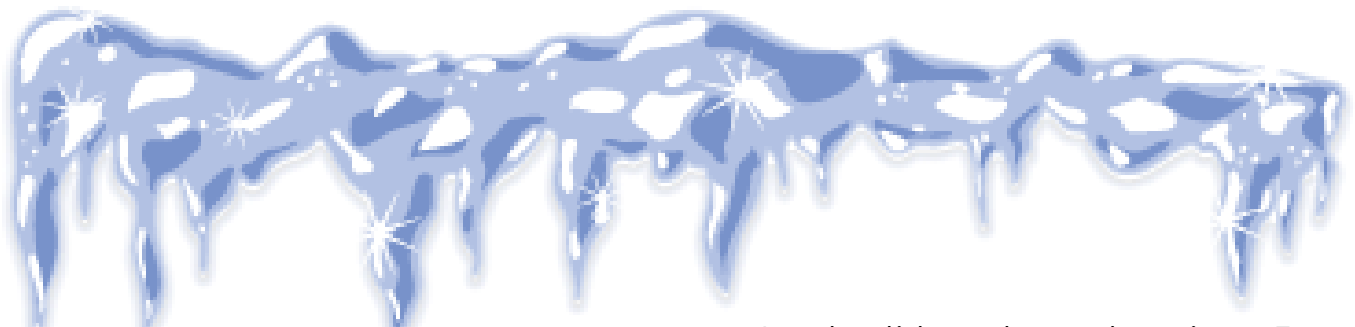
Remember your battle(s), but also remember your God and how He brought you through. He is the same God yesterday, today and forever (Hebrews 13:8).

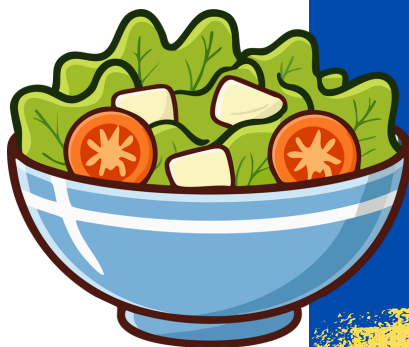

What is Emmaus?

The Walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. The program's approach seriously considers the model of Christ's servanthood and encourages Christ's disciples to act in ways appropriate to being "a servant of all."

The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with a 72-hour short course in Christianity, comprised of fifteen talks by lay and clergy on the themes of God's grace, disciplines of Christian discipleship, and what it means to be the church. The course is wrapped in prayer and meditation, special times of worship and daily celebration of Holy Communion.

The "Emmaus community," made up of those who have attended an Emmaus weekend, support the 72-hour experience with a prayer vigil, by preparing and serving meals, and other acts of love and self-giving. The Emmaus Walk begins Thursday evening and concludes Sunday evening.

Men and women attend separate weekends. During and after the three days, Emmaus leaders encourage participants to meet regularly in small groups. The members of the small groups challenge and support one another in faithful living.
