The Holiest of Weeks

Holy Week. Including the bookend Sundays, these are the most sacred eight days of the year for Christians.

Also called Passion Week, it is Jesus' final trip to Jerusalem. It has great highs, devastating lows, then a history-changing climax. We find here the crux of the Christian faith between the two Sundays. In fact, a little over one third of the content in the Gospels is dedicated to recording the events of this week. And as we examine the details, we see how the week began with "Hosannas" and ended with "Crucify Him."

Here is one incredible fact: Jesus knew exactly what He was doing. He knew this trip to Jerusalem would lead to the end of His life by way of crucifixion, yet with steady determination, He turned neither left nor right from God's will and design.

Paul wrote that Christ "...gave up his divine privileges; he took the humble position of a slave and was born as a human being. When he appeared in human form, he humbled himself in obedience to God and died a criminal's death on a cross." (Philippians 2:7–8, NLT)





May I pose the question? Could you have done that? Could you have knowingly faced an excruciating and humiliating death? I would venture to guess no. I know I wouldn't. It would be too much to contemplate, too much to bear. Even considering His sacrifice brings tears to my eyes. Maybe then we can understand more fully the agony of Gethsemane.

I recently became aware of a hymn-like song written by Stuart Townend. Let me share the first verse. Take it with you as you make your way through this Holy Week.

How deep the Father's love for us,
How vast beyond all measure.
That He should give His only Son,
To make a wretch His treasure.
How great the pain of searing loss,
The Father turns His face away.
As wounds which mar the Chosen One,
Bring many sons to glory.

The cross—in all its horror—brings us to glory. The whipped, thorn of crowns laden Son of God, dying a criminal's death, produces a righteousness within us. His death gave us life!
