"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead; For you have been born again, not of perishable seed, but of imperishable, through the living and enduring word of God." (1 Peter 1:3,23)

It's Springtime the time where we are awakened from the frigidity of winter, the season of cold temperatures, darkness, and hibernation to rejuvenation and an awakening of all that had gone to sleep.
