CHARLIE BROWN AND HIS CHRISTMAS TREE

I grew up on television, so when Christmas comes around, I reminisce about the Christmas specials that came on television every year when I was a child. The abominable snowman in "Rudolph, the Red-Nosed Reindeer" always gave me nightmares. At first, I was frightened of "The Grinch," but I came to enjoy the hilarious dialogue and creative animation. There were so many: "Frosty the Snowman," "Santa Claus is Coming to Town," and of course "It's A Merry Christmas, Charlie Brown."

You remember the story. Charlie Brown, the kid that can't do anything right, the kid with the world's longest losing streak as a pitcher, who never has kicked a football. Charlie Brown goes out to buy a Christmas tree for the school play. As he reaches the lot, he considers what kind of tree to buy with the little money he has. In a corner, he finds a small, lifeless tree, crooked and sparse, and this is the one he buys. Everyone laughs as he brings it to the school play, sits it down, and half the needles fall off.

I may be sentimental, but I always felt for that tree and Charlie Brown because, as a child, I felt like Charlie Brown, the kid who had bad things happen to him, who was teased on the playground at school. Pastor Gary Wheeler's Latest Book Revisits the Holy Land


